# For the Beauty of the Earth 1864

Folliot S. Pierpoint (1835-1917) is the author of this great hymn. Pierpoint was born in Bath, England and after graduating from Cambridge, he was a classics schoolmaster at Somersetshire College in his home area of Bath. But because he had received an inheritance, he did not need a regular teaching position and could afford the leisure of personal study and writing.

One day when he was 29, Pierpoint found himself walking in the countryside outside of Bath on a beautiful spring day. He saw the green of the ocean, the blue dome of the heaven and the winding Avon River cutting through the landscape. Inspired by the view and God's creative brilliance, he wrote this poem in 1864 and published it in a collection called "Lyra Eucharistica" – fittingly, as "Eucharist" derives from a Greek root meaning 'grateful,' and was intended primarily for communion services in the Anglican Church. His poem was set to music by Conrad Kocher in 1838 and quickly became a widely known and loved hymn. He published *Chalice of Nature and Other Poems* (1855) which was republished in 1878 as *Songs of Love*.

Little else is known about Pierpoint. He died in 1917 at the age of 82. This hymn is one of only a few songs devoted purely to giving thanks. Ralph Waldo Emerson observed that if the constellations appeared only once in a thousand years, imagine what an exciting event it would be. But because they are there every night, we barely give them a look. One of the evidences of the Holy Spirit's work in our lives is a gradual awareness of all God gives to us. God wants to make us people who exhibit a thankfulness in proper proportion to the gifts and blessings we have received. Let us enjoy the words while we take time to sing this hymn today.
