

All to Jesus I Surrender 1896

"I Surrender All" is a Christian hymn, words written by American art teacher and musician, Judson W. van DeVenter (1855-1939,) put to music by Winfield Weeden and published in 1896.

Judson van DeVenter was born on a farm near Dundee, Michigan to John and Eliza Ann van DeVenter. van DeVenter graduated from Hillsdale College with a degree in art education and later became the supervisor of art in public schools in Sharon, PA. In addition, van DeVenter was an accomplished musician, singer and composer. In 1880, when he was 24, van DeVenter married Malissa Miller. They had three children and lived in Summerfield, Michigan.

van DeVenter was well known as an artist but was also very active in the Episcopal-Methodist Church and involved in the church's evangelistic meetings. He surrendered fully to Christ and became an evangelist, traveling extensively throughout the US, England and Scotland. He wrote the text of this hymn while conducting a meeting at the Ohio home of noted evangelist George Sebring.

van DeVenter said of the text: "For some time I had struggled between developing my talents in the field of art and going into full-time evangelistic work. At last the pivotal hour of my life came, and I surrendered all. A new day was ushered into my life. I became an evangelist and discovered down deep in my soul a talent hitherto unknown to me. God had hidden a song in my heart and touching a tender chord, He caused me to sing."

van DeVenter had his own radio program called "The Gospel in Song and Story." He was well known as a hymn writer and published more than 60 hymns in his lifetime, but this one is his most famous.

Along with others, Billy Graham credits him with having influenced him in his preaching and the great time students had in van DeVenter's home for fellowship and singing.

Judson van DeVenter died in Temple Terrace, FL at the age of 83.
