

I'll Fly Away 1932

Albert Brumley (1905-1977) was born into a family of sharecroppers on a cotton farm in Indian Territory, near present-day Spiro, Oklahoma. The medium of radio was gaining popularity as he grew up. One hot Oklahoma day, Albert was in the field picking cotton and singing "If I Had the Wings of an Angel." The thought of flying away suddenly seemed quite appealing to him and he began composing "I'll Fly Away" on the spot. "I was dreaming of flying away from that cotton field when I wrote 'I'll Fly Away," he later said.

In 1926 Brumley enrolled in the Hartford Musical Institute of Hartford, Arkansas and studied there through 1931. Brumley married Goldie Schell in 1931. They lived near Powell Missouri and raised six children.

Of course, "I'll Fly Away" is about far more than escaping cotton fields. It expressed Brumley's personal hope of eternal life through Jesus Christ. It was one of a number of gospel songs he wrote during those days but all of them were stashed away in drawers and boxes, unpublished.

With Goldie's encouragement Brumley mailed "I'll Fly Away" to the Hartford Music Company. It was published in 1932 and shortly after, Brumley was hired by Hartford for \$12.50/month. Brumley later purchased Hartford Music Company in 1948.

He spent 34 years writing for Hartford and Stamps/Baxter companies before forming the Albert E. Brumley & Sons Music Company. Brumley wrote over 800 songs. He established the *Albert E. Brumley Sundown to Sunup Gospel Sing* in 1969 in Springdale, Arkansas. In 1970 Brumley was inducted as a charter members into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame (NSAI) and the Gospel Music Hall of Fame.

Brumley died in Powell, Missouri at the age of 72.
