

Blessed Assurance 1873

Frances Jane "Fanny" Crosby was born in Putnam County, NY in 1820, the daughter of John and Mercy Crosby. John Crosby became ill and died in November, 1820, leaving Mercy Crosby widowed at aged 21. Fanny's mother went to work as a housemaid to provide for them and Fanny lived with her grandmother. Fanny was blinded in infancy through the use of mustard poultices on her eyes, which damaged the optic nerve. At age 8 Crosby wrote her first poem describing her condition. She later said "It seemed intended by the blessed providence of God that I should be blind all my lifeIf perfect earthly sight were offered me tomorrow I would not accept it. I might not have sung hymns to the praise of God if I had been distracted by the beautiful and interesting things about me." In 1835 she enrolled in The New York Institution for the Blind in New York City, staying there 12 years, first as a student then as a teacher. Fanny became an expert musician and was a very gifted writer. Fanny is well known for her teaching and her rescue mission work. In 1844 Fanny published her first volume of poetry, The Blind Girl and Other Poems.

In 1858 Fanny married Alexander van Alstyne, Jr., also blind, a former pupil and teacher at the New York Institution for the Blind. They had one child. Fanny began writing hymns in 1864 and, in all, wrote between 5,500-9,000 hymns. The exact count is unknown due to her use of many pseudonyms. Crosby was known as the "Queen of Gospel Song Writers". She also wrote 1,000 secular poems and had four books of poetry published.

Phoebe Knapp was one of Fanny Crosby's dearest friends. While Fanny lived in the slums of Manhattan and worked in rescue missions, Phoebe lived in the lavish Knapp Mansion in Brooklyn. One day in 1873, while Fanny was staying at the Knapp Mansion, Phoebe played one of her new compositions for Fanny. Fanny immediately exclaimed, "Why, that says, 'Blessed Assurance!". She quickly composed the words, and a great hymn was born.

Fanny's husband, Alexander, died in 1902 and Fanny died February 12, 1915 in Bridgeport, Connecticut.
