Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope that your Fall season is going well. Around the church, things are moving into full speed. The choir has sung for worship on the last two Sundays. They sounded great! And there is room for more folks to join them. The praise group at the middle service is also sounding great under Sarah's leadership. We also have some new faces involved in liturgy. Thanks to Clarence for organizing our liturgists.

In terms of discipleship, we are up to 6 Life Groups who are now meeting; four years ago there were none! During the week, Patsy teaches a Bible study twice and Clarence and Barb lead a Bible study every Tuesday night. Our adult Sunday School began at a new meeting time on September 24th at 10:05 after the Family Praise service. Anyone from any of the worship services may now attend this Sunday school class; and of course, the teens meet at the same time. The Children's Sunday school has also begun and meets during the sermon time at the middle worship service. I don't want to forget to mention the Salvatores are involved in Bible Study Fellowship which is a nondenominational Bible study. There is every opportunity for every member of our church to be engaged in Bible study and discipleship.

I also want to remind you that LPC is fully engaged in the community. We host at least 5 Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and Narcotics Anonymous NA) groups in our facility each week.

Our Soup Ministry will be starting up Tuesday, October 3rd under the Brown's leadership and we have several charity dinners planned for the coming school year.

Our church also supports several ministries to the homeless in our community as well as food and clothing ministries. Any number of our members serve in ministries to help out the community.

This is just a sampling of all that goes on at Lewes Presbyterian Church. And it all happens because of you. The church is not a building, but it is every one of you who are in fellowship together at our church.

Operation Christmas Child

The Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, started by Samaritian's Purse, is a tangible expression of God's love for children around the world suffering from poverty, war, natural disasters, & disease. Many of these children have never received a gift before and with these boxes and notes from families like yours, they learn they are not forgotten. Found in the shoebox among hygiene items, school supplies and a "wow" toy is an explanation of the Gospel in the language of that child receiving the box. Each child is given an opportunity to participate in a 12-week discipleship program called "The Greatest Journey" taught by local Pastors and volunteers.

Our campaign is every Sunday from October 15th through Sunday November 5th. Shoeboxes with instructions & an envelope for \$10 donation (shipping/processing) will be available at the Community Center staffed by OCC volunteers. If you would like to participate but can't pack a box you can make a donation to LPC Operation Christmas Child or you can participate in Build a Shoebox Online.

Boxes built online are sent to the hardest to reach places and are carefully prepared to abide by strict custom regulations so the box is sure to be received by a child.


JUNION BELL CHOIR

How does God bind up our sorrows and restore us to wholeness?



THE DEACON'S BENCH



Now that it is officially Fall, we

are surrounded with leaves changing colors, pumpkin – spiced "everything," cool temperatures, and Halloween decorations and costumes reminding us of the season.

What about Halloween? Pope Gregory III established Nov. 1 as All Saint's Day, also known as All Hallows' Day as a day to honor all saints of the church who had attained heaven. The evening before became a holy or hallowed eve – thus named Halloween.

What must a person do to be considered a saint? Are you a saint? Do you have the qualifications? Must you be canonized in the Roman Catholic church after you have died?

What does being a saint mean? The word *saint* belongs in the same word family as sanctification or holiness. All who believe in Jesus Christ and confess Him as their Lord and Savior are sanctified because of Jesus' death and resurrection as forgiveness of our sins. 1 Peter 2:9 says God chooses and sets apart those who are a holy nation for His special purpose and sends the Holy Spirit to dwell in us. By this we are to strive to live more Christ-like in this world. This is what Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1:2-3 "To the church of God ... to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ... 3 Grace to you and peace...." (ESV)

Pastor Greg answered two questions in his Sept. 10th sermon: Who am I? I am a child of God.

Why am I here? I am to follow God's commands and strive to live more like Jesus each day. And it seems we all are saints when we profess our faith as Jesus' chosen followers. Have you ever thought of this? So – Are you a saint? Yes, you are!

A simple children's hymn titled, "I Sing a Song of the Saints of God" was written by Lesbia Scott and published in England in 1929. It became more popular in the US in the 40s than in Britain. It describes all those who are saints. Here is verse 3:

They lived not only in ages past; there are hundreds of thousands still;

The world is bright with the joyous saints who love to do Jesus' will.

You can meet them in school, or in lanes, or at sea, in church, or in trains, or in shops or at tea;

For the saints of God are just folk like me,

And I mean to be one too.
