REPORT OF THE CHURCH LEADERSHIP TEAM [CLT]

Dear LAC family,

This has been a great year for LAC by multiple measures. We celebrate continued positive trending in our weekend services, new members, baptisms, and people that have accepted Christ as their personal Savior and engage at LAC regularly. We have noted a stabilization in family engagement and a posture toward greater engagement with kids and families at LAC. While our Riverside partnership is changing due to world events and the redeployment of our International Workers [IWs], we continue to see movement in supporting the Great Commission work. Such measures are encouraging. The most encouraging metrics are less tangible. Examples include the sense that the Gospel message is being spoken regularly in both formal and informal settings and that the work of discipleship is at the forefront of pastoral discussions. These are hallmarks of a place that seeks to "lead people to Jesus and His life-transforming work."

This is not to say we haven't had challenges this year. We have walked paths of loss with the passing of dear family and friends including 4 members. One of those members was Ruth Kaspar who attended LAC for over 90 years. We have been stretched in our various staffing searches as we look to follow the Lord in our steps forward. DISCIPLESHIP

Come and Grow

GROWING DISCIPLES TOGETHER

For over 100 years, LAC has consistently proclaimed the gospel. Yet like many churches, we've noticed people can attend services and join groups while still feeling spiritually stuck. We realized we were informing people about Jesus without effectively helping them follow Jesus in everyday life. Through the encouragement of the Eastern PA District of the Alliance, a team of leaders went through a one-year workshop on effective disciple making. Over the past three years, we have gotten clarity on our context, our season, and what discipleship could look like at LAC.

Through pilot groups with LAC Men and Women using the tools we've developed, we're discovering what Jesus modeled: spiritual growth happens best in an authentic community. Participants are moving beyond Sunday politeness into real relationships where they encourage each other, pray together, and learn to see their stories within God's larger story.

CORE LIFE PATHWAY

A disciple, in our view, is someone who is following Jesus, being changed by Him, and is committed to His mission. We believe this to be an ongoing invitation to be more present with Jesus, surrendered to Jesus, and others-focused as Jesus leads - as LAC defines its Core Values.

The Core Life Pathway is about creating spaces where effective life transformation is taking place in this way. We're not replacing existing ministries but asking how they can function where:

- Authentic community replaces superficial friendliness.
- Conversations go deeper than "How are you?" "Fine."
- People naturally share their faith because they're genuinely living it.
- Small groups multiply as people guide others.
- A cultural shift of people growing in Jesus is the norm, not the exception.

These spaces may be created by how we show hospitality and love to others around us, and by how we use and redesign our physical facilities.

DISCIPLESHIP

Come and Grow

These activities are increasingly being integrated into LAC gatherings. **Core Life Groups** of 3-6 people are forming to walk and grow together using tools for Bible Reading, Prayer, and sharing our Story. The gospel stays central and Jesus remains the hero. They're communities where we practice following Jesus in real time.

WHERE WE'RE GOING

Our LAC mission is transformational: What if LAC became known as a place where people don't just attend church, but are genuinely changed by Jesus? What if visitors looked at us and thought, "I want what they have"?

Jesus' final command was "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19)—not just for pastors, but for all of us. As we're transformed by Jesus, we naturally invite others into that same transformation.

OUTREACH GLOBAL & LOCAL

OUR STRATEGIC PRIORITY

As part of our mission statement and commitment to Jesus's command in Matthew 28:18-20, LAC has a strategic priority to establish mission-aligned partnerships both globally and locally. These partnerships are designed to be mutually beneficial, allowing us to serve others while also learning how to be more effective in our own spheres of influence. They are also intended to be multi-generational, where everyone can serve alongside anyone.

GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP | RIVERSIDE

Toward having a gospel presence in a rapidly changing world, we began an official partnership with Riverside in a creative-access country. LAC has sent four teams to serve and build relationships: A Vision Team served and confirmed our partnership in 2022. A Medical Team provided vital training in 2023; one family later shared that they used what they learned to save their baby's life. An ESL Teacher served for a full term, and a Construction Team helped increase the capacity of their community centers in 2024.

The Riverside model of meeting basic needs in the community to create a gospel presence has served over 6,000 people and has even influenced the design of the Alliance's new national headquarters. Their community center is a place where people can gather, feel at peace, and see that there is something different going on in the people serving there. For LAC, it reminds us to ask how we can best use our facilities.

Due to military conflicts and changes in grant funding, the work in Riverside has been dramatically affected. The work will reformat in ways still being determined. Our main contact team there will continue to oversee this work but will be based in Ukraine after their home assignment ends in 2026. We are in conversation with them and other international workers about ongoing and potential new global partnerships.



OUTREACH **GLOBAL & LOCAL**

LOCAL INITIATIVES

We celebrate several local outreach initiatives from this past year. One powerful example began with Bethany Christian Services, with whom we worked to sponsor a refugee family from Ukraine. Although BCS's Lancaster office has since closed, our congregation embraced the family. Many people provided rides, tutored English, and supported them during their dramatic transition. The family has now moved into their own home, with both parents and older children working. They are doing very well and often thank us and speak of their "beloved church."

We continue to actively explore way in which the Lord is leading us toward intentional local outreach. For example, our building is being used to exercise loving hospitality with organizations like Servant Stage, a Christian-based theater group. We've also hosted conferences and other entities, and are actively exploring ways in which hospitality leads to effective gospel conversations within our community.

Within our congregation, people are involved in other local outreach activities, such as leading a Bible-based after-school program at the nearby Country Club Apartments, or volunteering and serving at places like Water Street Mission, Anchor, Seeds, Inc., Lancaster Prison, and in other ways. This past year, our church also rallied to gather and deliver a truckload of supplies for hurricane disaster relief.

LOOKING AHEAD

As partnerships may change or new doors may open, we want to remain faithful. We want to be serving and sharing the gospel in our local spheres of life, as well as being a church community where people are being transformed and also looking to be others focused as Jesus leads.



OUTREACH **GLOBAL & LOCAL**

LOCAL OUTREACH | CAMP CONNECT

As LAC seeks to be others-focused as Jesus leads, we are grateful for the 55 volunteers who invested in the 52 children (mostly from LAC) attending Camp Connect from August 4-7. Additionally, a generous team of 6 helpers cared for 12 preschoolers of parents volunteering at Camp Connect.

Volunteer training continued to emphasize that what we do matters because declaring and living out the truth of the gospel matters. Many volunteers put gospel-focused conversations into practice during the few hours we had with the children each evening, which was encouraging. Campers not only learned a skill and their Bible verse during camp, but also heard that Jesus loves them and that they are valued because God created each of them.

As we continue to pray that the gospel message takes root in their hearts and minds, we prayerfully seek direction for increased local outreach to our community.





FAMILY **ENGAGEMENT**

HISTORY

We completed a Family Engagement initiative that was launched five years ago, to explore data and trends to better understand what was happening, so that we could prepare an appropriate response. We celebrate the insight and headway that the Lord has granted as well as the culmination of a lot of work, but also to set the stage for the next steps ahead.

GOAL

Create a gospel-centered environment that engages the next generation and their families to serve, equip, and reach people in the life-transforming work of Jesus. We believe Jesus accomplishes this through us by...

- Providing a safe environment for the next generation to engage in biblical teaching.
- Equipping healthy Jesus following leaders through development and training.
- Creating fun and engaging interaction with caring adults.
- Developing and providing resources that empower parents to disciple their families.

WE CELEBRATE

- Increase of kids and students on our rosters.
- Increase of families with school-aged children regularly engaging in Next Gen ministry.
- The stabilization of family engagement over time parents and kids evidenced in our discipleship initiatives.
- We are grateful for our volunteers and staff who serve on a regular basis. Their engagement with the next generation is consistent, intentional, and gospel-focused. Each of them have been vetted and have opportunities for development and training to be well developed for serving our next generation.
- The hiring of Bill Cliff as Director of Next Gen ministries as Sarah Rosati transitioned to a part-time administrative support role.

Our Pro+ group is for active, working, professional singles over the age of 35 who are looking for friendship, fellowship, and a desire to serve others. It is also for outreach for those who do not have a home church.



PRIMETIMERS

Primetimers is for mature adults and retirees, but welcome all who desire to come. Primetimers seek ways to use their lives as a testimony of God's love as they serve in their community. They desire to:

 Build healthy relationships and create meaningful fellowship through bus trips and luncheons.

• Provide opportunities for personal and spiritual growth.

• Minister to the needs of retirement age adults with the LAC community.





LAC WOMEN



LAC Women provide opportunities for women of all ages and stages to join together for the purpose of caring for and encouraging one another through honest, open, and authentic relationships. As stories are shared with one another, it is our desire to help one another grow and mature in godliness in order to better serve our families, our church, our communities, and our world. Our gospel-focused conversations occur around:

- Bible studies
- Encouragers a fellowship for single women over 60 who are widowed, divorced, or single by choice or circumstance
- Minis and Me young moms in the same phase of life who are expecting a baby or mothers of young children through kindergarten
- Alliance Women gatherings highlighting our C&MA Eastern PA District international workers, and workers in our church with other missions groups
- Page Turners open discussion, learning, and fellowship centered around books that the group reads
- Casting our Nets for those with experience or a desire to learn knitting or crocheting
- Prayer groups
- Saturday morning monthly breakfasts
- Flourish a 9 month mentoring journey for women over the age of 18
- Women's Retreat annual gathering of women for gospel-focused and Jesus' lifetransformation conversations

LAC MEN

LAC Men promote a solid, balanced, biblical education to build men who are growing spiritually, being equipped for ministry, sharing their faith, and leading in their home, workplace, and community through spiritual life and development, service, and connection opportunities such as:

- Saturday morning monthly breakfasts

DEACONS, TRUSTEES & DEACONESSES

DEACONS

The Deacons are members of Lancaster Alliance Church and qualify according to the scriptural standards for church leadership. They oversee the benevolence ministries of LAC and are in charge of receiving and disbursing money from the Deacons' fund. They work with individuals who are in crisis by providing spiritual encouragement, physical assistance, and financial help. They desire to assist people in finding long-term solutions to issues that may be part of their lives. Throughout the year, the Deacons have financially assisted community agencies (i.e. local food bank), LAC families, oil changes for single women and older adults, and grocery gift cards for widows. We are grateful for the financial contributions from within the LAC community to be others focused as Jesus leads.

TRUSTEES

The Trustees are members of Lancaster Alliance Church and qualify according to the scriptural standards for church leadership. They are responsible for the maintenance and development of the buildings and grounds of the church in conjunction with the administrative staff. Throughout the year, the Trustees assisted with roof repairs, tree removal, security camera installation, carpet replacement, ministry house repairs, mulching, new door locks, and new security doors in the preschool area. We are grateful for each Trustee and their skilled care of our facilities.

DEACONESSES

The Deaconesses are appointed by the Church Leadership Team [CLT]. They provide encouragement and assistance to the body, and those in life transitions. 

2024 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE **MEMBERSHIP MINUTES**

OCTOBER 20, 2024 - 6:30 PM

- 1. Welcome & Call to Order: Pastor King called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Pastor King read I Corinthians 1:10 and led a time of prayer.
- 2. Appointment of Tellers: Pastor King appointed Jared & Faith Feister, Rick & Donna Jones, and Ken & Ruthie Spade to serve as tellers for the meeting.
- 3. Determination of Quorum: A quorum was present with 101 members in attendance on-site and 63 members in attendance online. In accordance with the Lancaster Alliance Church By-Laws, a quorum is determined by 25% of the membership in attendance. With 371 active members on the membership list, 93 members were needed for a quorum. There were 6 non-members also in attendance on-site.
- 4. Minutes of Last Year's Annual Meeting: Pastor King announced that the minutes from last year's Annual Meeting of the Membership were remanded to the Church Leadership Team (CLT) for review and approval. Accordingly, no motion is needed to approve the minutes. Pastor King noted the minutes were provided to the membership for their review following approval and are also included in the annual report.
- By-Law Revision: Pastor King reviewed a proposed change to the Lancaster Alliance Church bylaws to adjust the term limits of the liaisons that serve on the Church Leadership Team (CLT). Pastor King said the CLT consists of seven individuals – 5 elders and 2 liaisons – and all seven individuals have a vote. The by-laws specify a term of two years for the liaisons without the ability to serve an additional term. Pastor King noted there is required reading for the CLT members and it takes some time to be familiar with the governance role. Pastor King also noted the inconsistency between the elders and liaisons with years of service and terms allowed. Pastor King said the by-law revision would standardize that all members of the CLT would serve three-year terms and be eligible to serve two terms (total of six years). Pastor King responded to a question regarding how the current liaisons would be impacted by the revision and said terms would be extended by one year. Pastor King responded to a second question regarding how the revision impacts the number of CLT members up for election annually and said there would be only two members up for election each year -2 + 2 + 2. Pastor King moved and Mike Julian seconded a motion to approve the by-law revision as detailed below. The motion carried with three members voting against the motion.

By-Law Revision:

Two at-large members shall be elected by the membership to serve on the Church Leadership Team. Such liaisons must be members of this church and qualified according to the Scriptural standards for church leadership. The term of office shall be a term of three calendar years. A liaison may serve two consecutive full terms on the Church Leadership Team, but then must take at least a one-year sabbatical before being elected to another term. Such liaisons may be male or female.

Pastor King explained the nomination of Katie Sandoe to serve as liaison on the Church Leadership Team would not be needed since the by-law revision was approved and Brooke Kabakjian's term has now been extended by one year. Pastor King said there have been no nominations subsequent to the report being presented. Pastor King said election would occur by ballot unless a motion was made and approved to dispense with the vote by ballot. Keith Woods moved and Nikki Hess seconded a motion to dispense with ballots for the election. The motion carried with unanimous approval. Caleb Reely moved and Juan Millet seconded a motion to approve the candidates as recommended by the Nominating Committee. The motion carried with unanimous approval.

- **7. Financial Reports:** Pastor King said the church finished the fiscal year well with income exceeding expenses by approximately \$33,000. Pastor King noted a significant gift provided to the church from Charlie Samas' estate and the approximate \$600,000 gift was earmarked for capital improvements. The gift was not reflected in the financial reports due its designation. Pastor King noted use of the gift will become part of the conversations that already began regarding capital improvement projects at the church. There were no questions regarding the financial reports.
- 8. Mission & Vision Presentation: Pastor King said the report is full of numbers that are exciting! Pastor King celebrated the 5 conversions, 11 baptisms, 20 new members and 530 average attendees. Pastor King said the greater celebration is the work happening outside of numbers. The Church Leadership Team and pastoral staff have been investing focus on gospel conversations and discipleship. Pastor King discussed the words in Matthew 4:19 as they relate to discipleship and reviewed a vision focus to 1) follow Jesus, 2) be changed by Him and 3) join Him in His mission. The mission statement of LAC aligns well with this vision. Pastor King said the CLT has been working on Core Values that will tie the vision and the mission statement together and selected three words that aid in identifying what a disciple looks like Present ("Leading People to Jesus" in the mission statement), Surrendered ("Life Transforming Work" in the mission statement) and Others Focused ("Locally and Around the World" in the mission statement). Pastor King noted a focus on discipleship will influence the way we look at Sunday services and Life Conversation classes. Pastor Kint noted this emphasis even had an influence on the budget that is being presented.

- **9. Presentation of 2024-25 Budget:** Pastor King reviewed the proposed budget for 2024-25 of \$1,107,184, noting an increase of 3% from the 2023-24 budget. Pastor King said the budget reflects a change in salary costs with the movement of the accounting function to an outside entity. Pastor King responded to a question and explained the shift allows expertise to be utilized for payroll and accounting needs. Pastor King noted that an outside entity will be engaged to assist with the fundraising needed for the capital improvement projects.
- **10. Vote to Approve the 2024-25 Budget:** Herb Fisher moved and Jesse Skaggs seconded a motion to approve the 2024-25 General Fund Budget as presented. The motion carried with unanimous approval.
- **11. Season of Prayer:** Pastor King led a time of prayer over discipleship, the core values, the budget and the pastoral staff.
- **12. Report on Voting Results for Election of New Leaders and Budget:** Since voice vote was used for all action taken at the meeting, voting results were already announced.
- 13. Acceptance of Reports and Commitment of the Minutes to Church Leadership Team for Review, Edit and Adoption: Nikki Hess moved and Keith Woods seconded a motion to accept the reports presented and commit the minutes of the meeting to the Church Leadership Team for review, edit, and adoption with subsequent posting. The motion carried with unanimous approval.
- **14. Adjournment:** Nikki Hess moved and Keith Woods seconded a motion to adjourn. The motion carried unanimous approval. The meeting adjourned at 7:33 p.m.
