

FBC Grandview Student Pastor Job Description

PURPOSE

- To provide leadership, development, and oversight of the Student Ministry (6th - 12th graders) and its staff/volunteers as it pertains to the vision, mission, and strategy of FBC Grandview.
- To promote a biblically based lifestyle among students while encouraging the development of the Christian disciplines: Scripture memorization, prayer, personal Bible reading, evangelism, worship, and giving.
- To provide students opportunities for ministry leadership, outreach to the community, and participation in mission activities.

QUALIFICATIONS

- A growing personal relationship with Jesus Christ, evidenced by action, attitude, and behavior.
- An individual who meets the qualifications for a pastor listed in 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9.
- A love for all types of students and a passion for seeing them come to faith in Jesus Christ.
- A humble and teachable team player who consistently has the vision of the church as a whole in mind.
- Ability to relate to students and their families in ways that encourage their spiritual growth.
- Effective communication skills—written, verbal, and interpersonal.
- Strong leadership skills both in ministry and at home.
- Strong organizational skills.
- Christian professionalism in appearance, words, and actions.
- Willingness to embrace change, innovation, and creativity.
- Skill of enlisting, equipping, and leading staff/volunteers to teach and minister to students and their families.
- Bachelor's degree preferred; seminary degree is a plus.
- At least 3-5 years of Student Ministry experience desired.
- Experience leading large groups of students desired.
- Experience equipping and working alongside a large group of adult volunteers desired.

TIME REQUIREMENTS: Full-time (40+ hours per week)

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Wednesday Night Service

- Organize, facilitate, and lead a biblical and Spirit-led worship experience including;
 - Music
 - Preaching
 - Invitation/response time
 - Games/ entertainment
- Recruit volunteers to assist with:
 - Supervision of students
 - Preparing, serving, and cleaning up the meal
 - Leading small groups
 - Helping with games/ activities
 - Praying with students
 - Providing spiritual guidance
- Provide training for volunteers

Sunday Morning Lesson

- Write/ Organize lesson for Sunday School
 - Choose/create curriculum
 - Lead teaching
 - Give direction to volunteers

Student Ministry Activities & Events

- Organize and lead 5th Quarter events after home football games.
 - Coordinate with the other Baptist churches in Grandview.
 - Delegate duties to volunteers to coordinate events.
- Facilitate and organize Disciple Now (DNOW) weekend, held annually in January or February.
 - Coordinate with other Baptist churches in GV.
 - Churches rotate as the host church
 - Secure volunteers and student leaders to facilitate the event
- Organize and lead outreach, discipleship, and fellowship events for Junior High and High School students
 - See You/ Saw You at the Pole
 - FCA
 - Meals for sports teams
 - Etc.
- Have an active presence at school lunches and school activities at Grandview Junior High and High School.
- Organize and facilitate the student band in concert with the Music Minister.
- Organize and implement a purposeful plan to develop leaders amongst the student body.

Camps & Summer Activities

- Organize Super Summer and/or Youth Summer Camp opportunities
 - Recruit and secure volunteers to attend and serve as leaders
 - Organize fundraising activities to help raise money for students to attend camp
- Work with the Lead Pastor and Missions team to plan and have students participate in the summer mission trip.
- Ensure that the student ministry remains active during the summer.
 - Work with volunteers to provide a variety of activities
 - Communicate with students and families throughout the summer

Sunday Morning Church Attendance

- Attend both 8:30 am and 11:00 am worship services unless there is an extenuating circumstance and the Lead Pastor approves of absence.
- Be available to assist the Lead Pastor with service, including but not limited to:
 - Pray
 - Make announcements
 - Help with sound/media
- Be available and willing to fill the pulpit and preach on Sunday mornings, particularly in the Lead Pastor's absence.

Office Schedule

- Work with the Lead Pastor to coordinate the weekly office schedule.
- Be available for weekly staff meetings on Wednesday at 9:00 am.
- Assist with creating weekly announcements.
- Be available to meet with students or adults during the week when needed.
- Attend monthly deacons' meetings and give a report on the Student Ministry.
- Ensure continuous communication with students, parents, volunteers, church body, and community.
- Develop and maintain an engaging social media presence for the Student Ministry.

Team Player

- Help as needed in the other ministries of the church.
- Be mindful of the church's schedule in planning events.
