#### Learning from Our Brothers and Sisters in Christ

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us."

- Hebrews 12:1

If you're active at FBC Grandview, you've no doubt already heard me talk about our recent trip to Rome. Our wonderful friends, and fellow church members, Jim and Diana Richardson invited us to accompany them on the trip that was, in part, a celebration of their 15th wedding anniversary. It was a truly amazing experience. We got to see and learn about the history of not only Rome but of Western Civilization dating back even before the time of Jesus. As a life-long Baptist, it was eye opening to experience the history of the Roman Catholic Church etched in the churches, buildings, and even streets of Rome, eventually learning to appreciate how all of what we were learning was the history of our church, of really every Western Jesus follower. We also just had a blast. We ate amazing food including all kinds of pasta, pizza, calzones, amazing breads, meats and cheeses, steak, and of course gelato and cappuccino. We took in our first rugby game in Rome's Stadio Olimpico, host to the Olympic games back in 1960. We even got to hear an Italian musician perform Johnny Cash and Lynyrd Skynyrd one evening over dinner . . . this was the same musician who was kind enough to point out to me that my last name, which was printed on the back of the shirt I was wearing, is very close to a curse word in Italian. Succinctly then, it was a great trip that I'll remember forever.

What made the trip truly transformative though was not the beauty of the ancient architecture, the lavishness of the feasts, or the fun of living in the moment. No, I was transformed by the Holy Spirit of Christ, who decided, as He always does, to come along on the journey. As a Protestant, I've grown up hearing for ages about the evils of the Catholic Church. I've heard everything from the Pope is the antichrist to the Catholic Church is trying to secretly take over the world and establish some Satanic rule. There's not much love for our Catholic brothers and sisters in many of our Baptist churches. And to be fair, the Catholics get a lot wrong. Most obviously, many deify Mary and other saints, giving glory and honor to humans that belongs only to God, many look to their own church tradition and teaching of their modern leaders as equal in authority to Holy Scripture, and many also directly contradict the idea of the priesthood of all believers through their teaching of the priest as a mediator between them and God and the necessity of taking the sacraments of the Church in order to receive the grace of God. There are some other issues for sure, but those are the three main ones that come to mind. So now that you know I'm not suggesting we all convert to Catholicism, maybe you'll hear my following point with an open mind.

We can learn a lot from other Jesus followers, even those with whom we strongly disagree on certain doctrinal issues. There is a palpable reverence for Christ present in many of the churches we visited that I am unaccustomed to in our own tradition. Every piece of architecture and art throughout each basilica was created to teach spiritual truth. You can't

help but lower your voice to a whisper when you walk into one of the many churches in Rome and your eyes are inescapably drawn upward to meditate on the art all around you. Furthermore, there was a great sense of connection that enveloped me during our trip. The Church, while expressed well as one local body of believers, is also the multi-national and timeless body of Christ. The Catholic Church, for all its imperfections, has stewarded our history well for almost 2,000 years now. I was able to walk the pathways of ancient catacombs where my fellow Jesus followers buried martyrs centuries ago. I tread the very same path that the Apostle Paul most likely took to enter Rome. I saw the places where historians are pretty sure the Apostle Peter was imprisoned in Rome. Succinctly then, the history I witnessed was not just the history of the Catholic Church, it was the history of the Church... and it was my history.

As the author of Hebrews said, we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses. Let us not let our modern propensity for contention and strife lead us to disregard the brotherhood we share with those who have come before us. Jesus has done amazing things through his Church for almost two millennia, even as the Church has embroiled itself in controversy after controversy. I'm grateful for my trip. I'm grateful for the men and women of Christ who preceded me in the story of the Church. I'm grateful for the institutions that have preserved the history I learned about. And most of all, I'm grateful for the one who it's all about, Jesus, the Messiah, the Savior of the World.
