Easter Under Quarantine

"Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

-Matthew 28:20b

I often joke about ministry related tasks for which I never received any training in seminary. For instance, there isn't any course over how to remove a rat snake from a church bathroom, which I could have used one summer day a couple of years ago. I also think a cooking class should be a must in a Baptist seminary as it speaks to one of our members' favorite love languages, but alas, there are no culinary courses in seminary. In recent days, I wished I would have taken a course over how to lead a church through a government imposed time of extreme social distancing because of a global virus pandemic.

There is no playbook for how to respond these days, not only in ministry but in almost every other sector of our society as well. While we are grateful to have the technology to meet on-line, we miss the faces of our church family, along with the handshakes and hugs. There simply is no replacement for face-to-face physical interaction. We believe, though, that the day for our regular gatherings will return soon. Until then, we will rest in the knowledge that we belong to a church that is bigger than a building. The church cannot be confined to one room. As we gather together online to worship and pray, we are doing so as one body...and we are joining a global community of people doing the exact same thing.

As I write this article on March 19th, it looks as though we have a long road ahead of us, one that will potentially keep us from meeting together for months. That means, that we could even be meeting on-line for our Easter Sunday services. The Easter memories I hold most dear are those that involve a church body gathered together. The church my family belonged to throughout my childhood and adolescence had traditions just like every other congregation. The annual egg hunt took place on my grandfather's land amongst a small creek and hundreds of mesquite trees. We divided the eggs by age group, even having some well-hidden (sometimes buried) eggs for the teenagers to find. Afterward, was a game of baseball and hamburgers. I always looked forward to these events with excitement. My heart hurts knowing that this tradition and countless others are on hold for American churches and families.

Perhaps, though, this "Easter under quarantine" can shine a new light on an old story for all of us. Jesus' 11 remaining apostles, along with others, had essentially quarantined themselves in the upper room during the days following Jesus' death. They were not responding to a disease though. No, they were hiding in fear, likely hoping that they would not also die as Jesus had. As they hid, there were undoubtedly others around them celebrating Passover as they always did. I wonder if the 11 and the others spent any of that time longing for the days of old when they would gather with their families and celebrate Passover, each with their own unique spins on the ancient tradition. It likely seemed as though this Passover would be lost, ruined, and emptied of its wonderful meaning. But something happened.

Their feelings of loss, confusion, and fear were replaced by wonder and

an inexpressible joy. Yes, they missed the Passover celebrations of old, but they received something much better...a Risen Savior. Jesus, who they all faithlessly believed to be dead, was not only alive, but He was resurrected to an ETERNAL life. I can only imagine what it must have been like to have been in the upper room when the truth was revealed. I imagine tears of joy, gasps of unbelief, and of course embracing. It is in the midst of the deepest darkness in all of history, the death of the Godman upon a cross, that the greatest news was shared. Jesus IS ALIVE!

From that point forward, followers of Jesus would continue to endure hardship. One only need to read Acts and Paul's letters to discover that things didn't suddenly get easy for Jesus' followers. If anything, they got more difficult, but something was different. They were motivated by something else the world couldn't see. They knew that even in the midst of worldly difficulty, including their own deaths, that they had a hope and a future that could not be shaken. They KNEW that God would ensure their best outcome. They believed it so strongly that they were willing to die as martyrs if need be or to give their entire lives spreading that good news to others.


Perhaps you're reading this article feeling disconnected, fearful, or frustrated about these days. If so, may I interrupt all the bad news with THE good news. Jesus is still alive. He is still on His throne. And the promise remains, one day He will make all things right and call us to live in glory and peace with him for eternity. Celebrate this truth today and every day. The Definite Article . . . In the English language we have three articles that we use to refer to various nouns: "a", "an", and "the." The definite article, "the," is the most specific. When we use the definite article to refer to something in a particular context, the object or event to which we refer is specifically identified. It occurred to me that there are many ob-

jects and events in the life of Jesus to which we refer with the definite article, "the." In the context of our Christian faith, we as believers easily identify many of these.

For example, when believers speak of <u>the</u> manger, <u>the</u> star, <u>the</u> rich young ruler, or <u>the</u> calming of the storm, most believers will likely think of a specific manger, star, cross, and storm being calmed, even though there are other mangers, stars, rich young rulers, and calmed storms in history. In this season of the year especially, we use the definite article in referring to objects and events about which virtually the whole word is familiar, even without a given context. How amazing it is to speak of <u>the</u> Last Supper, <u>the</u> cross, <u>the</u> Resurrection, and <u>the</u> empty tomb, knowing the eternal significance of these!

Let's make these history-changing topics a regular part of our conversations, particularly in the next few weeks as we approach Easter Sunday, April 12. Our "Service of Shadows" on Wednesday evening, April 8, will help us live out the tremendous contrast between the horrible hopelessness Jesus' disciples surely felt in the aftermath of the cross and the unspeakable joy they found once they discovered the reason for the empty tomb. Plan to experience these emotions with us in our Service of Shadows and our Easter celebrations. They will help all of us recall the truly amazing gift the Lord has given us.

This has been a really interesting couple of weeks leading up to the month of April. Everything that we are used to has been different. It has just been a bit weird. But maybe when things are weird, we have the opportunity to minister in new ways. We have the chance to reach our community in a

totally different capacity. Luke 6: 27-30 says, ""But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. ²⁹ To one who strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also, and from one who takes away your cloak do not withhold your tunic either. ³⁰ Give to everyone who begs from you, and from one who takes away your goods do not demand them back."

When we look at the person of Jesus, we realize that He didn't much like what the world expected Him to do. He functioned in the world altogether differently than what was expected. Let's look at another example. Jesus didn't run around with anyone from religious groups. He hung around with tax collectors, fishermen, thieves, and lots of other people. Jesus loved and spent time with sinners, like you and like me. He didn't invest all of His time with the religious people, no. He loved people that didn't deserve it.

Matthew 7:13-14 says, ""Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. ¹⁴ For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few."

He says that *many* enter through the broad gate. The broad path is a pretty normal path. It is the path that everyone does. But few people travel the narrow path. When we turn to Jesus, we discover that normal just might not be the best life. We have been called to look at what is normal and live differently. When the world is panicking, we have been called to provide care and show that we are not shaken by changing up our normal weekly schedule. Instead, we reach out and provide care for our





Experience G-d's Written Word Ancient Hebrew Scroll Project Sunday, April 26, 6pm FBC Sanctuary



Biblical Hebrew manuscripts are the Holy Scripture- received, recorded, and preserved by the Jewish people. They have been carefully copied from the originals throughout the millennia. These Ancient Hebrew Scrolls make up the only complete set of the TANAKH (Hebrew Scriptures, or what some refer to as the Old Testament) in the world that you can see.

Sixteen scrolls make up an entire TANAKH; however, this traveling Ancient Hebrew Scroll display contains all 16 scrolls plus duplicates making this collection a total of 40 scrolls.

Scrolls in the display are unique and most of them are 250 years old or older. Six of the scrolls in the collection were commissioned by this project to be written in Jerusalem by a scribe (sofer) when a worldwide search failed to discover those needed to complete the set. These ancient scrolls were written in countries all over the world: Israel, Poland, Iraq, Morocco, and Russia to name a few; however, each scroll at different times and in its own history, made its way to Jerusalem and from there was discovered and purchased by this project. Each scroll has a look and a story of its own.

Make plans today to come see and learn about these ancient scrolls as they are displayed here at First Baptist in our sanctuary on April 26th at 6pm. Be sure to invite someone to share this historical experience of the written Word surrounding our Christian ancestry with you and your family.


