Making Room for Summer

Some of my favorite memories growing up happened in the months of June and July. My summers were full of VBS at church and church youth camps when I got older, but there was also just a lot of time to be a kid. Summer was the time for camping out on my grandfather's land and vacationing with my family. Summer was also a time to hang out with good friends: riding our bikes, jumping our RC cars off cliffs, and late-night spotlight varmint hunting (when I was an older teenager, of course). There were things we had to do to get ready for school and football season of course, but there was plenty of room for fun and discovery.

I wonder sometimes if that room no longer exists for families during summer. It seems summer has become yet another time of the year we fill up with event after event. It has become another occurrence of us saying to ourselves, "If we can just get through (insert event here) then things will calm down," all the while we know that there are more things waiting on the horizon to make "calming down" a pipedream. Then suddenly we look up, and the kids start school in a week.

I must confess that I say all of this somewhat hypocritically. In this newsletter, (which we have pared down quite a bit by the way... hope you appreciate it) you will find news of many events we have on our church calendar for the summer months. These events include Super Summer, Vacation Bible School, Kids Camp, Youth Camp, and Mission Trip. Now, I believe all these events are important and could be spiritually meaningful moments for those that attend. Even with church activities, however, we can overburden ourselves and leave no room for rest and play... things that summer should be about!

So, if you'll allow me to, I'd like to give you some summer homework. First, go on a vacation with your family. Even if you think you're too broke, there are lots of ways to travel on

the cheap. Stay in a campground, sleeping in a tent, or find a way to have a staycation in the backyard and shut yourselves off from the outside world for a few days. Live alone? You can still go on a vacation. Treat yourself and go somewhere you've always wanted to visit but haven't.

Second, pull out your summer calendar and figure out three things (or at least one if you can't do three) that you can say "no" to and clear them from your calendar... even if they're church events! Take those newly empty days and schedule some time for fun family activities at home. Maybe you can have a family game night or invite some family friends over for a barbecue. Get creative and design a murder mystery date with your spouse and some couple friends. Then when anyone asks you to do something on those days tell them that you already have important plans for those dates.

Finally, for extra credit, find some room for a small spiritual retreat. Whether it's at home or somewhere away, take two or three days to be alone with God in prayer and Bible reading, listening for His voice in the quiet place you've made in the middle of your busy life. Above all, make room for summer. Have fun. Rest. Be with your family and spend some special time with God. Summer is meant to be a break just like it used to be. Why not make summer fun again this year?!


