School Matters More than You Know

“Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.” Proverbs 22:6

August arrives with a familiar mix of excitement and nerves. Backpacks are filled, schedules tighten, and the slower rhythm of summer gives way to early mornings, homework, and the steady beat of a new school year. Yet in the middle of supply lists, open houses, and first-day photos, one of the most strategic seasons for our church family begins: the opportunity to walk with children and families as they step into the classroom.

School is far more than academics, sports, and extracurriculars. It is a daily mission field where young hearts are shaped by ideas, friendships, pressures, and opportunities. For many children, the school year becomes the place where faith is either strengthened or quietly tested. It is a concentrated season of influence with teachers, peers, coaches, and screens all speaking into their lives. What we do at FBC in these months can plant seeds of the gospel in Grandview that last far beyond report cards and graduation.

Statistics and stories consistently remind us that the early years of life are decisive for faith. Research continues to show that the majority of people who follow Christ make that commitment before adulthood. The school years are not neutral ground. They are formative years. When children leave our homes each morning, they carry with them either a clear sense of identity in Jesus or a growing uncertainty about who they are and what is true. We have the privilege and the responsibility to speak truth, offer support, and point them back to the One who never changes.

At FBC, the start of the school year is one of the highlights of our shared life. It is a beautiful picture of the body of Christ working together - parents, teachers, volunteers, mentors, and pray-ers all playing their part to encourage the next generation. Children who may feel the weight of new

challenges often find steady ground through the relationships and truth they encounter here. Families are welcomed, burdens are shared, and the gospel is applied to the real questions of everyday life.

The beauty of this season is that it doesn't require perfection. It simply requires willing hearts. Whether you pray specifically for students and teachers, encourage a parent who is overwhelmed, volunteer in a children's or youth ministry, write notes of encouragement, or simply show up consistently in worship and community, your involvement matters. Every conversation, every prayer, every word of truth spoken can be used by the Holy Spirit to steady a child, or even an entire family, in the grace of Jesus.

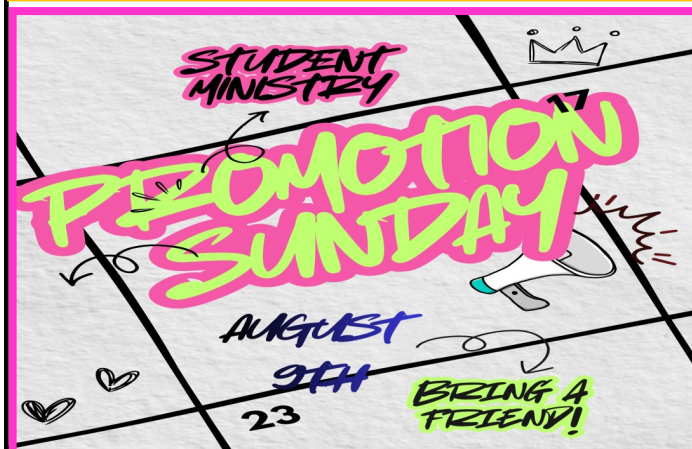

Pray daily for the hearts, minds, and friendships of every student who walks through our doors or sits in a classroom this fall. 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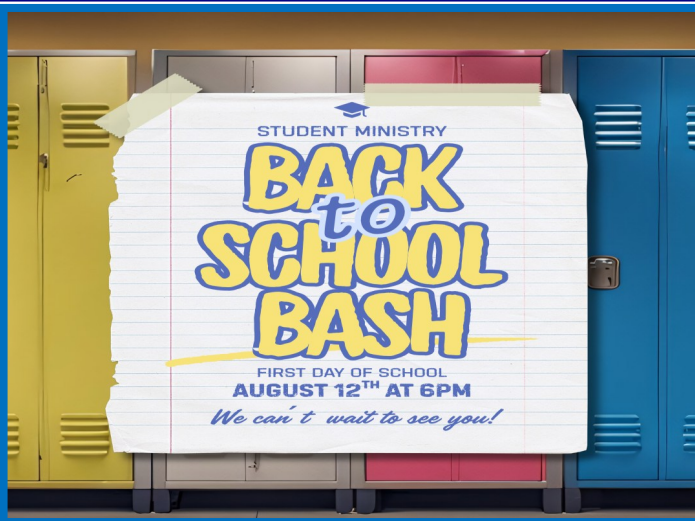
