Church family,

I don't know about you, but I could not be looking forward to the "BER" months more than I am right now. You know, SeptemBER, OctoBER, NovemBER, and DecemBER. While I type this, the high today is expected to reach 106°F. So far this summer we have had more than 30, 100+ degree days, this one being #18 in a line of consecutive, exhaustingly hot days. That is why the BER months are so appealing right now. With them we typically look forward to cooler temperatures, sweaters, and cozy fires. It's hard to imagine needing, let alone WANTING a jacket right now, but I have hope it's not too far off. They also represent a new season. School is back in full swing, schedules are beginning to fill with activities, and families are settling into their new routines after a summer off. It's an exciting time and I'm reminded of something my mother-in-law said to me once, that it's not the seasons that she enjoys as much as the CHANGE that they bring. When summer starts, we are all looking forward to long, lazy days, vacations, swimming, sno-cones, etc. but by the end we are DONE with the heat and ready for CHANGE. Fall, historically speaking, fulfills that change. The relief we feel when the first cold front blows through or the first good rain in months refreshes the earth, leaves us longing for more. Fall then turns into winter and we embrace down time. Being cooped up in the house on a cold winter's night, cuddled up by the fire, and sipping hot cocoa... goodness it sounds wonderful! Then winter turns to spring and oh the wonders of spring! When the trees start to bud and flowers bloom, warmer temperatures mean a return to outdoor activities and planting and gardening, and beholding God's perfect design and how He makes all things new. It's marvelous. But as it often does, spring gets busy, so we look forward to summer where we can relax and unwind a bit and thus the cycle repeats. Year after year, season after season, God is faithful to provide just what we need, and I am always amazed at God's craftmanship. Nothing in creation was an accident, not the seasons-they certainly have a purpose, and not even the change of season that brings about hope and a refreshing new start.

In Genesis, God makes a covenant with Noah, that He would never again destroy all life with a flood. If we look to the change of seasons through a holy lens, we see the pattern of the seasons reflected

in the very story of time, from beginning to end. There was creation, the fall, redemption, and restoration. If we parallel the two, creation can be compared to summer, where in theory life flourishes under the summer sun. Summer then gives way to fall, the fall of mankind through sin. Then we have winter which is redemption. People seek shelter indoors during the long hard winter months and have time to reflect and look forward to spring or the rebirth where God restores all things. In fact, it is made better than ever.

So, as we enter a new season, consider what changes need to take place in your heart so that God's design and purpose can blossom. Change can be hard, but it can also bear much fruit. The 3rd Chapter of Ecclesiastes tells us that "There is a time for EVERYTHING, and a season for every activity under heaven..." and Romans 12:1-2 declares that our change should not come from the world, but from God. What does that change look like in my life? In your life? In your daily walk? Does it include giving up something that takes the place of quiet time or adding time to serve? Each of us must undergo our own changes, but if we keep God's will our focus, we have hope. "...the old has gone and the new has come." 2 Corinthians 5:17.

Church family, it is with love that I challenge each of us to CHANGE according to God's will and invite you to look to this new season as the perfect opportunity. Greet the new season, the BER months, with open arms and an eagerness to draw closer to the Lord.


