MERRY CHRISTMAS church family!

One thing you ought to know about me is that I do not try to hide my Christmas spirit. AT ALL! In fact, you can often hear Christmas music playing in my office year-round. Spoiler alert: I'm listening to Christmas music as I write this article! But it seems like I almost always have to "defend" my choice in music and every year the back-and-forth banter about this topic never really changes anyone's mind. You either listen early or you don't. For me, the Christmas season brings a joy that I can't easily put into words, but it almost always starts when I hear a special Christmas hymn or some instrumental version of one of my favorite songs.

One hymn in particular, "O Holy Night", is a favorite of mine. This hymn focuses on the incarnation of our Savior. "O holy night! the stars are brightly shining; It is the night of our dear Savior's birth." Here the song describes the night as holy. A holy Savior has come to be born of a virgin. God became like man that we may have eternal life and I'm thankful for that every day. Then it describes the stars brightly shining. Now, I'm no11t sure we can know for certain what the weather was like 1on the night Jesus was born, but we do know at some point there was a star shining so brightly that it led the Three Wise Men to Jesus. Perhaps using that as a reference, the author describes a night full of brightly shining stars and I can picture it in my mind. One of my very favorite things to do is look up on a clear night in some remote location and gaze in wonder at God's creation. How marvelous and vast is the night sky! That coupled with the holy birth of my savior calms me and fills my heart with such JOY and a PEACE which surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7).

Then, we have HOPE. "Long lay the world in sin and e'er pining, 'Til He appeared and the soul felt its worth. A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices," The weary world rejoices indeed! Sin is exhausting. Period. Our constant pursuit of earthly things leaves us weary like the hymn suggests. But the good news is, it doesn't have to be that way. God sent his son so that in him we can find HOPE. How much lighter do my shoulders feel when I am no longer pining over my sin, but remember instead that my Savior came to earth to die for my sins? I will rejoice because I know the truth, and the truth has set me free (John 8:31-32).

Then the call to LOVE one another. "Truly He taught us to love one another; His law is love and His gospel is peace." God calls us to love one another (John 13:34), not fight over politics, money, and religion. He does want us to "be on guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong. [And] Do everything in love." (1 Corinthians 16:13-14). But in LOVE is the key and I need this reminder daily! God loved us so much that he sent his one and only son to save us (John 3:16) and in a world full of hate, let us be guided by LOVE not only during the holidays, but all year long.

So... church family, the next time you hear a Christmas song, hymns specifically, I encourage you to view it from a point of worship, not just a seasonal obligation. We don't have to limit the celebration of the birth of our Savior to a few weeks a year. Love came down to earth so that in him we can find JOY and PEACE and HOPE and LOVE forevermore.

Merry Christmas. I pray you and your loved ones are blessed this Christmas and all year long.
