Typically, the Jesu or Canon in D is used for Mothers or Brides Maids. Sometimes the Mouret RONDEAU is used for bridesmaids or even bride. The Clarke "Prince of Denmark's March" is the most often suggested bride's march, followed by Campra "Rigaudon" or Charpentier "Te Deum".

PLEASE NOTE: The responsorial psalm will be sung. Your preparation booklet, "**Together for Life**" does not have responsorials which are all set to music. Thus we will choose the responsorial psalm from a combination of sources including the **SUNDAY LECTIONARY**, that is, the responses as seen in the missal for Sunday Masses.
