

Our manger scene is probably the earliest of the Douglas Wells scenes still in existence. Not one of the more elaborate cast sets, our creche characters were simply cut out of flat masonite and painted with sign paint for Townsend Brothers Funeral Home most likely in the 1940's or 50's. After years of use, the figures were in such disrepair that they were stored under the old funeral home building rather than being thrown away. When the pieces were rediscovered several years ago, Deborah Townsend Vestal thought that our church lawn would be the perfect place for the scene, if only it could be restored. Dr. Morris shook his head when he saw the figures, but volunteers hauled them to the then derelict Chivers' house. They called our own Lana Thomas to look at them. She had no idea how the figures could be repaired, but she took them to her house to wait for inspiration. Lana had known Douglas Wells and wanted his work saved.

One by one, Lana repaired the flaking paint, saving every stroke that could be saved. She developed a technique of her own that could hold Wells' paint securely to the boards and repainted areas of total loss. A group of volunteers then covered each figure with marine varnish. The figures are showing signs of wear once again and the Douglas Wells story needs to be told for a new generation. Keeping the figures in good repair requires work, and setting up the scene each year is a labor of love. Thanks to the Townsend/Vestal family for saving this historical creche, and thanks to all the volunteers who helped bring it back to life.
