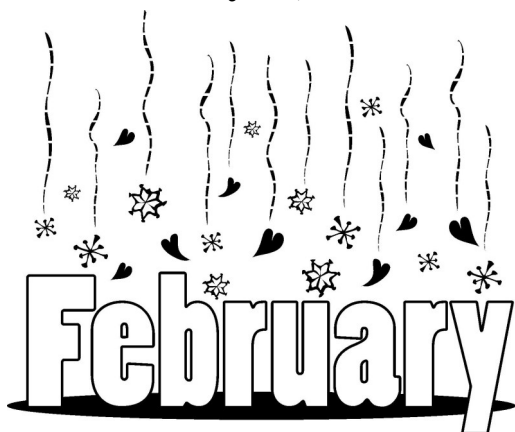

In one such case it is said that he healed the eyesight of a daughter of a local magistrate.

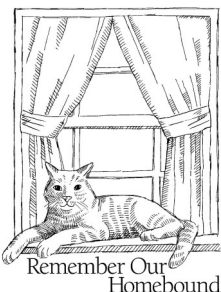

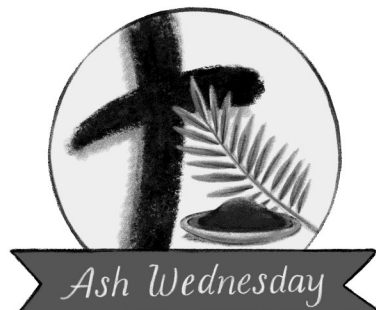

February Board of Director's

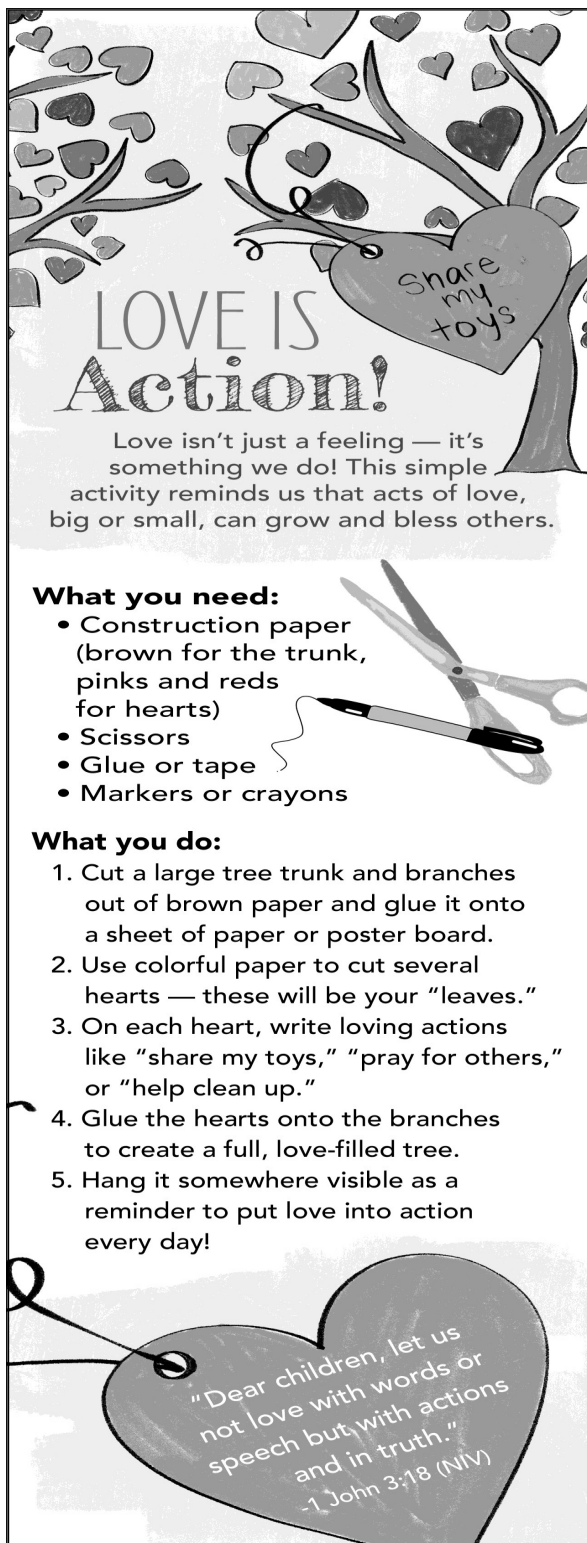

NEW RECURRING FEATURE

The SAM group is interviewing the Elders individually and will publish those interviews in the coming Newsletters. This is a way our congregation can get to know a bit more about these men who serve in church leadership. This month the spotlight is on Tim Hartnett.

HOMETOWN BOY SCORES BIG

Tim Hartnett long time local teacher and coach, was born in Bakersfield in 1950 and graduated from Foothill High School in 1968. His dad and mom moved here at a young age and his dad worked in retail for many years until he too, became a teacher. His mom was a housewife, raising the children (2 brothers and 2 sisters) as Christians and she was the spiritual leader in the home. Tim's early education was at Redeemer Lutheran School in the Southwest where he completed K-2nd grades. He believes his religious foundation was built there. He then attended public school where at a very early age he came to love all kinds of sports and athletic endeavors, especially team sports and their dynamics.

He met his wife, Linda, at LaVerne College where they were both very involved in athletics. What attracted Tim to Linda was her carrying around a puppy. They were cute and he liked them both. They married near the end of his junior year. Tim taught science and math and coached football, wrestling and track at Bonita High in LaVerne, CA.

As the family grew, he took the head football coaching job in Lindsay, the Exeter High. After Prop. 13 passed the school district made cuts so he took a job at San Marino High School (also referred to as Beverly Hills East). After one year there, the family decided it was a very expensive place to settle down so back to the valley and Delano High they came with Amy (1974), Caleb (1977) and Lindsay (1980) now in tow.

One morning in 1984, Paul Briggs (arguably the best known football coach in Kern County history) called and offered Tim a job at BHS. Tim looked over his shoulder and spied Linda with the suitcases already in her hands, ready to make the move. After two years working with Briggs and then eleven more with Pat Preston as head coach, Tim took the helm. He coached for five more years there. He decided to step back from coaching in order to spend more time with his family and travel with them during summer vacations. When the new Golden Valley school opened, they offered him the head coach job and he spent years there until some parents from Highland called and asked him to transfer to HHS. It was close to home and so he coached there for four more years. He involved all of his kids as "stat girls," "ball boy" and football player, thus keeping them close. "Linda was the best coach I ever had-total involvement!"

One thing that Tim is most proud of is that he has felt blessed to be a part of all the young men's lives he touched. He has a great sense of pride in them even now, many years later as he gets to see them, hear from them and enquire about their families.

The Hartnetts joined LCOP in 1992 and have remained active members to this day. They have sat on most of the boards at church, some for many years. Tim is the Elder for Flock #6.

The list went on and on.

About then I decided to hang up and keep on gossiping. But then I remembered what the Bible says about God and how he attends to our needs. He doesn’t route our prayers through a heavenly call center or put us on hold. We don’t get busy signals, menus or automated voices.

Instead, our Father listens instantly, personally, and lovingly. Instead of a voice mail system, he says, “Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear.” (Isaiah 65:24, KJV)
