Reflections on my Drive Home...

This past week I was coming back from the annual California-Nevada-Hawaii's LCMS district conference and upon coming back from the conference I was reflecting on something mentioned at the conference. It was something district president Micheal Lange said in his opening sermon for the conference. He began with a basic simple question for the assembly.
