1 Samuel Overview

Authorship and Date

The author is unknown (<u>anonymous</u>) but it is commonly speculated to be <u>Samuel</u> himself

The date of writing (if the author is Samuel) of course would be prior to his death in **1015 BC**

I and 2 Samuel are originally I single book in the Hebrew Bible

Scope

First Samuel traces the transition of leadership in Israel from the time of the judges to the time of the kings, chronicling Israel's shift from a **Theocracy** to a **Monarchy**

The book covers a <u>93</u> year period of history between the birth of Samuel and the death of Saul

Key Figures and themes

There are 3 key figures: Samuel, Saul, and David

The pride of <u>DISOBEDIENCE</u>, The humility of God-honoring <u>OBEDIENCE</u>.

I Samuel is the first book to use the word <u>Messiah</u> "anointed" in 2:10.

Theological focus

YHWH is sovereign

Organization

<u>Samuel</u> (1-7) <u>Saul</u> (8-31) <u>David</u> (16-31)

Culture

A culture of honor and shame
