- b. He is <u>co-equal</u> with the Father and the Spirit

2. He did not set aside his deity, He added humanity

Gavin Ortlund's grid (Finding the Right Hills to Die On; the case for theological triage)

- **1.** (**First** rank doctrines) **Essential** (that which is essential to the gospel itself)
- (Second rank doctrines) Urgent (to the health and the practice of the church)
- **3.** (**Third** rank doctrines) **Important** (but not enough to separate over)
- **4.** (**Fourth** rank doctrines) **Unimportant** (unimportant to our gospel witness or ministry collaboration)
