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WHAT WE BELIEVE

Bethel Church

I. GOD

LIABILITY RELEASE AGREEMENT

for members of a Short Term Missions Team solely organized by Bethel Baptist Church, Fairbanks, AK

The undersigned wishes to participate in a short-term mission trip (herein the "Activity") with Bethel Church, Fairbanks, Alaska who is providing assistance in arranging this trip.

Bethel Baptist Church, Fairbanks, Alaska and the undersigned agree that the Activity poses risks including the following specific risks: sickness, crime, political instability, governmental opposition to missions activities, as well as similar and dissimilar risks (herein the "Risks").

For and in consideration of *Bethel Baptist Church*, *Fairbanks*, *Alaska* assisting the participant in the Activity, and other good and valuable consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the undersigned for him self/herself and his/her personal representatives, assigns, heirs, distributees, guardians and next of kin (herein the "Releasors"), hereby irrevocably and unconditionally releases, waives, discharges and covenants not to sue *Bethel Baptist Church*, *Fairbanks*, *Alaska* and its affiliates, subsidiaries, divisions, members, directors, officers, employees and agents (herein the "Releasees"), for and from all claims of any nature now or hereafter existing whether known or unknown, including but not limited to, all liability to the Releasors, on account of injury to the undersigned or death to the undersigned or injury to the property of the undersigned, whether caused by the negligence of Releasees or otherwise, while the undersigned is participating in the Activity.

The undersigned is fully aware of the Risks and other hazards inherent in the Activity, and voluntarily assumes the Risks and all other risks of loss, damage, or injury that may be sustained by the undersigned while participating in the Activity.

The undersigned also agrees that he/she bears the sole responsibility for any and all medical expenses which he/she incurs while participating in the Activity, whether for injury or illness, and whether required as a result of the undersigned's participation in the Activity or not. The undersigned acknowledges Releasees are under no obligation to, and do not, provide medical insurance for the undersigned.

The undersigned further agrees that he/she bears the sole responsibility for any and all travel expense which he/she incurs in the event his/her team leader or other project leadership finds it necessary to send the participant home prior to the scheduled departure date, whether for health or physical limitations or inappropriate or immoral behavior, and whether required during the undersigned's participation in the Activity or not. The undersigned acknowledges Releasees are under no obligation to, and do not cover travel expenses for the undersigned.

Lastly, the undersigned agrees that he/she assumes responsibility for all loss and damage of his/her personal items during the Activity, and holds Bethel Baptist Church harmless for his/her injury or death, or for any hostage situation he/she is subject to, during the Activity.

The undersigned warrants that he or she has fully read and understands this Liability Release Agreement and voluntarily signs the same, and that no oral representations, statements or inducements apart from the foregoing written agreement have been made to the undersigned.

Bethel Church Guidelines for Short Term Mission Teams

Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

STM trips should be <u>strategic in mission</u>, with <u>well-prepared</u> people who have a commitment to <u>serving others</u>

Objectives

For Bethel Church:

- Promote STM trips that will meet the needs of the target people and effectively utilize the gifts of each team member
- Increase interaction with missionaries
- Grow individually and corporately in commitment, understanding, and participation in missions

For the Team Members:

- Deepen relationship with God by preparing and serving as a short term missionary
- Experience who God is and how He works through us to spread the gospel
- Participate in a team training program to unify the team
- Learn to share with others what God is doing in your life before, during, and after the STM trip
- Assist full time missionaries and church workers
- Further the witness of the gospel to the target culture
- Observe first hand missionary life
- Experience working in a different culture and language

For the Mission Board:

- Promote STM opportunities for the people of Bethel Church by providing information and organizing teams
- Provide guidance and encouragement
- Provide financial assistance
- Assist in coordinating training
- Provide prayer support

Approval Criteria for Team Members

- Show evidence of a relationship with Christ, a Godly lifestyle, and a heart for missions
- Must consistently attend Bethel Church or another evangelical church
- Agree with the doctrinal statement of Bethel Church as presented in the "What We Believe" (attachment A)

• Be approved by the Mission Board through an application which includes references and a personal interview with the Mission Board and the team leader

Team Member Responsibilities

- Spend time in God's Word and prayer on a consistent basis
- Demonstrate the ability to share the gospel and give a personal testimony
- Share about the trip during a Church service, Sunday school, cell group, or AWANA
- Gather prayer partners
- Learning some basics of the target culture
- Raise financial support
- Attend all training meetings and fund-raisers unless excused by the team leader

Team Leader Responsibilities

Preliminary Trip Plan

6 months before the trip the Team Leader should submit a preliminary trip plan to the Missions Board. The trip plan should include the following elements:

- Destination
- Host Contact or Organizing Mission Agency
- Goals, Objectives, and Expectations
- Trip length and expected dates
- Potential team leaders and others responsible
- Proposed team members if known

Required Team Orientation

- Team member roles and duties
- Expectations of the Host Agency
- Goals for the trip
- Living conditions and what to expect
- How to be safe in-country
- Emergency medical and evacuation procedures
- Travel tips

Required Training

- Biblical basis for the Mission
- Biblical servanthood
- Spiritual preparation, spiritual gifts
- Interpersonal team relationships
- Cultural sensitivity and appropriate conduct and dress
- Training specific to the ministry
 - o i.e.: puppets, song leading, teaching, 5 day club

Financial Plan

Develop budget and financial plan to fund the trip and submit to the Missions Board at least 5 months before leaving. Include information on:

- Cost per person
- How the money will be raised
- Fund-raising ideas
