1. When have you been stirred in a worship service?
  
2. In a worship service on Sunday morning, there are several aspects to the service: singing, teaching, the Lord's Supper, offering and fellowship with others. Which is most important to you? Which is least important to you?
  
3. If heaven is going to be eternal singing, how does that make you feel?
  
4. What truly moves you to worship God? In the sermon, several "paths" were mentioned where people feel they can connect best with God: being in nature, serving others, art, music, solitude, etc.
  
5. The statement was made, "God makes us different."
  - A. If so, why do we tend to judge people who are not like us or worship the way we worship?
  - B. Have you ever been in a worship service where someone made you uncomfortable by the way they expressed themselves in worship? (Too expressive or too charismatic)
  
6. Since we are different, why does God mandate specific worship exercises to do together?
  
7. Read Colossians 3:16. What do you think "psalms and hymns and spiritual songs mean?" Are there specific kinds of music we should have in church?
  
8. Several answers were given as to why we sing: for God, for others, for ourselves, and for those outside the church to draw them in.
  - A. Which reason surprised you?
  - B. When it comes to singing for others, what are saying to others by the way you sing?
