#### Sunday School classes for every age

#### Children and youth

Children ages 5—10 will meet with Melanie Keeney to learn about the miracles and parables of Jesus. They meet in the classroom at the end of the hall in the education wing.

The youth class will meet with Shari Nelson in the youth room beyond the front of the sanctuary. Biblical literacy is the focus of this class. They will begin the year studying the book of Judges.

#### William Gurley Bible Study/Discussion Group (Adults)

The phrase, "beatitude collaborative," came to mind as the William Gurley Bible Class concluded its study last May. "Beatitude collaborative?" Think about it. (1) To collaborate is to take action together in mutual support of one another for accomplishing shared purposes. (2) Beatitude has to do with Christ's power to bless, and ours. Hmm! Collaborating in the power to bless! The power to bless, magnified through collaboration. Leads me to ask, Where in our life experience have we been influenced by the power to bless – as giver or receiver of blessing? How is the power to bless brought into focus, informed, and magnified in its connection with Christ?

This fall we'll explore what it can mean to function as a "beatitude collaborative," scoping out how such a body might operate and reinforcing the ways we already do it. It's grounded in Jesus, so we'll begin by discussing the materials we've reflected on via email this summer around the theme "Jesus as Provocateur." Hmmm! "Provocateur of Blessing?!" Then, we'll consider engaging with the energy of mercy, God's mercy, and how it figures into being people who practice the power to bless.

All are welcome. If you need to be blessed and want to bless others, check it out. This Bible Study/Discussion group will begin on Launch Sunday, September 7. After the opening assembly in Fellowship Hall, it will meet in its regular location, the Community Room, for an initial introduction.

#### The Storytellers' Class (Adults)

The Storytellers' Class will begin this year by tackling the book *The Bible With and Without Jesus: How Jews and Christians Read the Same Stories Differently*, by Amy-Jill Levine and Marc Zvi Brettler. As a class, we focus on the art of storytelling, thinking about how Jews and Christians understand the same stories in different ways will be an exercise in the art of listening to the stories we are told.
