This has been a very busy year for me and for many of you. There have been too many unexpected life matters which have popped up to be dealt with. Which brings me to now – not ready at all for the season of Advent.

This year I am going to need the Advent time to truly prepare myself for the coming Christ child. My heart's not ready; my mind is racing from one To Do list to another – Have I gotten everything done on the list? What have I forgotten? And on and on. I'm clearly not in a place of peaceful reflection and easing into welcoming the infant Jesus.

Not being ready is a big part of Jesus' story. Mary wasn't ready to be the mother of the promised messiah, but she stepped up anyway and found joy. Joseph wasn't ready to be the father of a child not biologically his, but he stepped into that role anyway and raised a son who followed in his father's footsteps as a carpenter. The shepherds, the Magi, Mary's cousin, Elizabeth and Zechariah – ALL were not prepared for the life events they found themselves living. And yet, we do not hear despair or sadness about what was happening. Rather we hear their response first as bewilderment and then profound humble gladness for an opportunity to be a part of a larger story. They did not know what challenges might lie ahead but they knew that God would be with them through it all – the good, the challenging. God brought them peace.

Advent is a time to "prepare" – to get our hearts and minds ready to hear again the story of the promised messiah and how it came to be. I can see this year, I will need more intentionality to slow down and allow God to enter the too busy schedule.

When we prepare for various events in our lives, many of us make a list so we don't forget anything. As you prepare this year, what will be on your list? How will you get ready to receive the Christ-child as someone who is hearing this good news for the first time? I'm thinking of young children and their sense of wonder as they hear the story of how much God loved people from the beginning and wanted a closer relationship. I see the curiosity on their face and hear the questions as they try to understand.



This Advent, leading into Christmas, be intentional in your preparation. Prepare not only your surroundings, but your heart and your mind. Pause and be present for God to help you hear new aspects of a story many of us have heard for decades and tend to skip over the miraculous aspects embedded in its telling. I take comfort in knowing that God has a history of bursting into the world whether we are ready or not - to be with us. Our Emmanuel: God with us.





Come home this Christmas to Cherry Hill Church as, once again, we go, "in heart and mind, to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass."


POTLUCK DINNER & GAME NIGHT - Saturday, January 17, 2026 5:00 pm - Memorial Parlor

YOUTH GROUP WITH THE PRESBYTERY OF DETROIT

Cherry Hill has joined the Presbytery-wide youth collaborative spearheaded by Geneva's pastor, Rebeka Fergusson-Lutz. About 15-25 youth from middle school through high school meet on the second Sunday of each month. The youth get to

know one another, play games, do activities and engage in spiritual conversation. It's a wonderful opportunity for churches (like us!) that may have just a few kids in their congregations. We rotate between churches, this year we have been to First Presbyterian (Northville), Geneva (Canton) and even an alpaca farm near Grosse Ile Presbyterian.

On Sunday, January 11, from 2pm-4pm, Cherry Hill will host the Second Sunday youth gathering. We will be doing a service project, making care packages for the homeless. The kits will contain supplies like socks, lip balm, bandages, granola bars and other items that our Cherry Hill kids have brainstormed during Sunday School. Each church group that attends will go home with several kits that they can pass out in their neighborhoods.

All youth ages middle school to high school are invited to join us. So, if you have grandkids or neighbors that you'd like to invite, please do. There will be food, fellowship and fun. Contact Anna Dewey if you'd like to participate.

Kroger Rewards



PIPE ORGAN CONSOLE PROJECT UPDATE

A Christmas present arrived a bit early this year, in the form of the final draft of the design of the new organ console's interior features (keyboards, stop controls, etc.). Approval was given to the Austin Organ Company (Hartford, CT) to go ahead and begin construction. Floyd Higgins, the company's senior designer, will be here in January 2026 to take a look at the pit in which the current console now sits, inspect the organ's pipe chamber for the installation of the new 32' bass pipes, and to also take a small section from an old pew so that the factory can match the color for the new console shell. Our second payment of \$30,000 was made at the end of November.

We are thrilled to report that as of this writing, of the \$190,000 needed for this project, \$176,000 has been raised – with a little over \$10,000 coming from the October 11th Bach Organ Marathon. Gratitude for this phenomenal support truly goes beyond what words can convey!!


