### 9<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL SOUPERBOWL CHALLENGE



## Note from the pastor



Here we are on the threshold of a new year. It's hard to believe we are about to begin the year 2026! This is often the time we step back and reflect on the past year and then consider what we might like to strive for in the coming year.

As I looked at last year's January newsletter here at Cherry Hill, I saw that we were in the midst of getting the first report from Self Study and preparing to have small group conversations. We were considering what ministries and pieces of church-life which were important and what other aspects we might consider. It was a time of reflection and dreaming in midst of hopeful expectation.

Now, one year later, we are further along in that in-between time. We've done the dreaming, at least gotten a good start, and are now waiting for the next called pastor to come.

Waiting is hard. If we are not careful, we can slide into being ho-hum about church-life. Recently, there was a sermon in which we considered "active waiting". In James, the writer encourages us to be like the farmer who plants the seeds but then lives in hopeful expectation for the seeds to receive what they need to grow – nutrients and water. The writer is describing what it is like for followers as they wait for "the coming of the Lord." What is said next is one of the most difficult aspects of the process: "You also must be patient." Just as the farmer must have patience as the seeds grow to maturity for harvest, we, as followers of Christ, must be patient as we wait for Christ's return.




So, what are we doing with this in-between time as we wait for the next called pastor to come? My hope and prayer is that we will approach the new year and God with a sense of Sacred Curiosity, where we—as individuals and as a community—might dare to wonder what God is up to in our lives, our church and our world. We started that process last year. What might we learn now in this season of transition? How might we grow together? What work is God equipping us to do together? What need is God calling us to address? How might we love others and love God in new expressions? There are so many ways to engage "active waiting."

Now is the time to check our status: bored—ho-hum—expectant. Where are you? How might you spark that sense of wonder, expectation and curiosity for what God is up to both personally and as the community of faith?

May 2026 be another year we experience the goodness of God. And may we continue to do our best to be engaged in being an active part of the ministry and mission at Cherry Hill Presbyterian Church.


### ANNUAL MEETING – Sunday, February 1, 2026



The session has called for the Annual Meeting of the Congregation and Corporation of The Cherry Hill Presbyterian Church for Sunday, February 1, 2026, immediately following worship in Fellowship Hall. The purpose of the meeting will be to review and receive reports from the committees and organizations of the church for 2025 and any other business that might come before the congregation. **The session will host an enhanced coffee hour that morning in Fellowship Hall!**

## 2026 PER CAPITA - \$41.00



Per Capita is crucial to the overall health of the PC(USA), because it binds presbyteries, synods, and congregations together in one church. Per Capita literally means “per person.” The Per Capita apportionment is an assessment paid to the General Assembly, Synod of the Covenant, and the Presbytery of Detroit for administrative costs at all three levels of the church. It is requested that each active member of all Presbyterian Churches pay the per capita apportionment, which enables churches to carry out the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ, locally and throughout the world.

Per Capita giving makes it possible for:

- ❖ Presbyterians to discern and live out God’s call in their lives
- ❖ Churches to connect with individuals seeking a call to ministry
- ❖ Staff support for General Assembly committees and commissions
- ❖ Management and coordination of General Assembly gatherings
- ❖ Presbytery and synod leaders to gather for training and discernment
- ❖ Counsel and support for churches in crisis (misconduct, legal matters)
- ❖ Presbyteries to address matters of inclusion, participation, and representation at all levels of church leadership and decision-making
- ❖ The denomination to build connections with ecumenical partners around the world
- ❖ Presbyteries and pastors to receive support on immigration issues
- ❖ Presbyterian history to be cataloged, preserved, and utilized by future generations

**This year’s per capita is \$41.00 per member.** Cherry Hill’s total 2026 per capita (based on our membership of 143 at the end of 2024) is \$5,863. Those who pay per capita help alleviate this financial responsibility of the church.

All members are encouraged to pay their \$41.00 during January (if possible) and place it in the offering plate, mail it to the church office, or pay online. While we and the presbytery greatly appreciate receiving per capita offerings in January, please be aware that per capita is accepted anytime during the year.



**Monday Afternoon Study: *When Bad Things Happen to Good People***

Beginning Monday, January 5, at 1:00 pm, in Memorial Parlor, Pastor Teresa will lead a 6-week study discussing the *New York Times* bestseller, *When Bad Things Happen to Good People* by Harold S. Kushner.

When Harold Kushner's three-year-old son was diagnosed with a degenerative disease that meant the boy would only live until his early teens, he was faced with one of life's most difficult questions: Why, God? Years later, Rabbi Kushner wrote this straightforward, elegant contemplation of the doubts and fears that arise when tragedy strikes. In these pages, Kushner shares his wisdom as a rabbi, a parent, a reader, and a human being. This classic book written in the 1980s still offers clear thinking and consolation in times of sorrow.


If Dearborn Public Schools are closed due to weather,

- The PNC continue to do their work, reading pastor discernment documents, listening to sermons and following up with interviews.


