## Note from the pastor



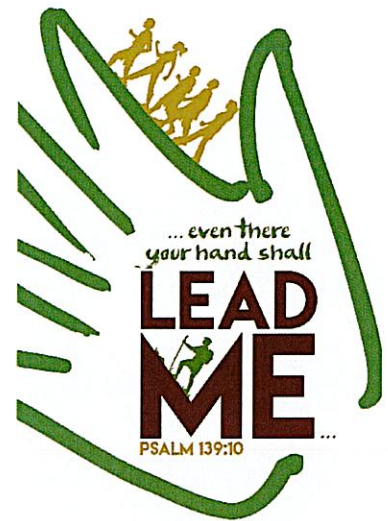
It's hard to believe that I have now been at Cherry Hill Presbyterian Church for a little more than a year. So much has happened!!

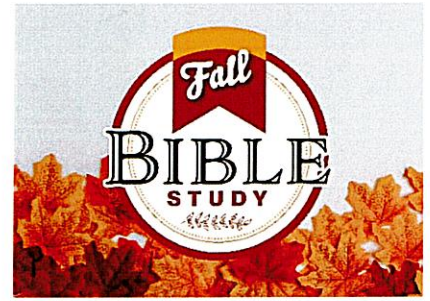

### 9:00 am Sunday – Book of Zechariah – Conference Room

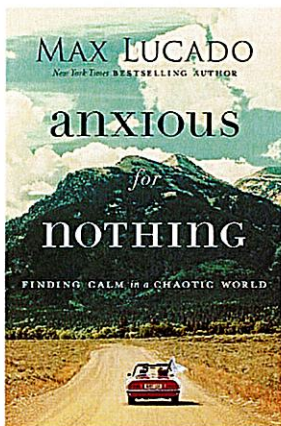
**Lead by Maged Radamis (begins October 5)**

- ❖ Discussed building security and training to de-escalate situations

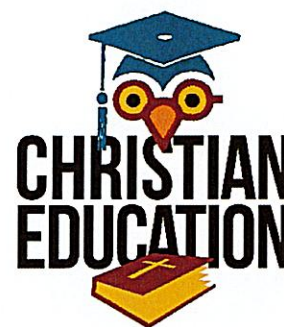


## PNC UPDATE

The Pastor Nominating Committee was created in early May and began meeting as a committee on May 10, 2025. The Committee includes the following members: Tracey Turbett, Char Greco, Kathy Kerr, Maged Radamis, Kevin Dewey and Matt Thibeau. The first few weeks were spent on foundational steps required by the Presbytery, setting up rules for the committee and then working on the Ministry Discernment Profile. The (MDP) is, broadly speaking, the job listing for the Pastor position at Cherry Hill Church. That MDP went through a process of being evaluated and eventually approved by both Cherry Hill Church's Session and the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM). That final approval was gained in early August and our MDP was entered on the Presbytery's Church Leadership Connection (CLC) on August 13. Our MDP's "going live" has generated over 20 automatic matches from around the country and 3 "self-referrals". The Committee is evaluating all the matches and self-referrals and will discuss them at its next meeting. At that point, we will determine which candidates to contact and move towards the first round of interviews.

The Christian Education Committee is looking forward to a great season ahead. We feel fortunate to be able to continue providing a variety of opportunities for our adults and youth.

**Acolytes:** Our reintroduction of an acolyte program last year was very well received (by the congregation and the youth), and we plan to incorporate the acolytes again on Communion Sundays. Our Sunday School program will begin on September 7, and we are grateful to our loving and supportive teachers - Kathy Kerr, Leslie Garber and Anna Dewey - who help our children grow spiritually through the year. We are sad to have said goodbye to the Elling family and appreciate all the many ways that Josh served the CE committee as a chairperson, teacher and friend.



**Youth Group:** As our youth continue to age, we have a unique opportunity to combine efforts with the Presbytery of Detroit for a Collaborative Youth Ministry program. The program is made up of several other Presbyterian churches who also have a small number of youth but would like to make sure they are spiritually fed. They host monthly meetups for middle and high school-aged youth (grades 6-12), called "Second Sunday" gathering. The events incorporate large group games and activities, as well as small group Bible and spiritual discussions. The first event of the season is **Sunday, Sept. 14** at First Presbyterian in Northville (start time is usually 2 pm or 3 pm). If you know any youth that would like to participate in this free opportunity, please contact Anna Dewey to sign up. The Dewey kids plan to attend!

**Childcare:** Olivia Gee continues on as our childcare provider every Sunday during worship. She is a wonderful caregiver, and we encourage all parents to drop off their young children upstairs in the childcare room before worship for an hour of uninterrupted "adult time" to nurture your own spiritual growth!

**CE Rooms:** And finally, a big thank you to John Renaud for all his work upstairs in the CE Rooms this summer. Though the summer school tenants didn't work out, the rooms still got a much-needed purge by Kathy Kerr and Anna Dewey, and John R gave the Sunday School Room, Art Room, Classroom and Youth Room a lot of TLC. The floors have been waxed, furniture has been moved and arranged, and there are even plans for a new pool table. Thank you as well to John Peterson for his hard work cleaning our spaces.

Thank you to everyone for your continued support of our Christian Education - from youth to adult. May we continue to spiritually feed our souls.

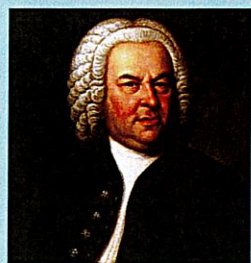
