She has performed as a soloist and chorister with the Choral Artists of Michigan and Holy Name Parish Schola on works including Fauré *Requiem*, Duruflé *Requiem*, and Mendelssohn *Hear My Prayer/O For the Wings of a Dove*. In December 2024, she made her soloist debut with the Macomb Symphony Orchestra singing the Bach Magnificat. Operatic roles include Susanna (*Le Nozze di Figaro*), Papagena (*The Magic Flute*), Lucy (*The House on Mango Street*), Sister Constance (*Dialogues of the Carmelites*), Patience (*Patience*), and Despina (*Così fan tutte*). She has participated in performance outreach with the Motor City Lyric Opera and sang with the 1950s Village Cruisers group at Greenfield Village in Dearborn, MI. Angela is pursuing her Master of Music degree in voice performance at the University of Michigan and studies with Caitlin Lynch.
