His musical experiences also include attending the Interlochen Arts Camp in 2024, 2025, and 2026, and being selected for the Michigan All-State Orchestra in both 2024 and 2025. With aspirations to major in music in college, Jisoo is committed to advancing his artistry and contributing to the future of classical music.
