This is all tied up with American Christian nationalism

- A simple taxonomy: FAMILY = religious nationalisms, GENUS = Christian nationalisms,
 SPECIES = American Christian nationalism(s)
- Globally, we are experiencing an eruption of religious nationalisms aligned with far-right politics:
 - Hindu nationalism in India
 - Buddhist nationalism in Myanmar / Sri Lanka
 - religious Zionism in Israel
 - Islamic nationalism (Islamism) in Turkiyé and Syria
 - Christian nationalism in Brazil vs. Hungary vs. Russia

Should we be worried about all Christian nationalism?

- We all have layered identities, and our nationality and politics are naturally important dimensions of our identities.
- Someone who answers "Yes" to the question, "Is the United States a Christian nation?" could mean:
 - A) Christians make up a majority of the U.S. population (that's always been factually true, though decreasingly so)
 - B) The U.S. was founded as a Christian nation on Christian principles (usually based on gauzy theological or mythical readings of the founding)
 - C) Christians/Christianity should be privileged over other communities or worldviews in America (this is antidemocratic Christian supremacy)
 - So how do we tell the dangerous Christian nationalists from the benign ones if they're all answering "Yes" to this question?










Paul Weyrich (1942-2008)

- The Second Vatican Council (Vatican II) was a landmark shift in the global Catholic Church in the 1960s.
 - the non-Latin mass
 - more interfaith dialogue
 - a downplaying of clericalism
- Since that time, there have been reactionary elements within the Catholic church aimed at rolling back or overturning the Vatican II reforms.
- Within the church, it manifests in an effort to elevate far-right priests through the church hierarchy. Politically, it manifests as an alliance with far-right Protestants, Eastern Orthodox, and even Neo-Nazis to reclaim Catholicism.



Moderate range: "postliberal" activists, Constitutional law professors, hyper-political priests and bishops

Extreme range: Neo-Nazis, groypers, militias tied to the All-Polish Youth (Polish Neo-Nazis)



Reformed ("Reconstructionist") Theological Nationalism



Rousas John Rushdoony (1916–2001) Emerged in the 1960s and 1970s around R.J. Rushdoony and Gary North

- Very influential (though subterranean) in the rise of the religious right in the 1980s
- Tends to be more intellectual/cerebral and theologically tied to Calvinism
- Created the concept of "dominion theology" and embraced a gradualist vision of "theonomy" (implementing biblical law in modern societies over generations and centuries)

consent by non-Christians. Non-Christians living among us are entitled to justice, peace, and safety, but they are not entitled to political equality, nor do they have a right to deny the people of God their right to order civil institutions to God and to their complete good.

We lack the spirit for this sort of dominion today—a once-uncontroversial spirit that animated the magisterial Protestant reformers and Christians prior to the Reformation. We must revitalize and return to it. The Christian's posture towards the earth ought to be that it is ours, not theirs, for we are co-heirs in Christ.




- ecstatic and experiential worship
- belief in modern prophecy
- longing for—and activity toward bringing about—local and/or global revival
- emphasis on spiritual warfare (angels/Christians vs. Satan/demons)
- (often) belief in Fivefold Ministry (apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, teachers) with a primacy of apostles and prophets
- tracking charismatic media and the celebrity televangelists, apostles, prophets, Messianic rabbis, revivalists in that class











C. Peter Wagner

(1930 - 2016)

- → Fuller Seminary professor of Church Growth
- → pioneered new modes of "strategic spiritual warfare" in the 1990s to combat elaborate hierarchies of demons
- → came to believe that he was a modern-day apostle and that charismatic apostles and prophets ("fivefold ministry") would inaugurate a global revival to establish Christian dominion over societies

Apostles and prophets are sent by Jesus to "disciple nations" (Matthew 28 — i.e., the "nation" becomes the object of Christian mission)




There are modern day apostles and prophets being commissioned and empowered by the Holy Spirit to bring about a global End Times revival




