

As much as Things Change...

Since there will never cease to be some in need on the earth, I therefore command you,
“Open your hand to the poor and needy neighbor in your land.”

Deuteronomy 15:11

It's just about that time again. The year 2025 with all its joys and sorrows will soon be behind us and the year 2026 with all its promise and predictions will soon begin. People around the

world have been caught up in the rituals surrounding this annual transition. Journalists have been reviewing the news of 2025; creating “year in review” montages as a global reflection on how much can happen in a single year. Economists, sociologists, technologists, and fashion trend forecasters have been creating predictions about the new trends for 2026; drawing us forward into a new future. Pyrotechnicians have been planning elaborate celebrations for major cities around the globe.

The changing of the year feels momentous. However, if we listen to Jesus speaking to his disciples in Matthew 26:6-13, we gain a different perspective. They were eating together at the house of someone called, “Simon the leper” when a woman entered the dining room and anointed Jesus’ feet with expensive perfume. Some of the disciples were angered by this, because they could have sold the perfume and helped the poor. Jesus supported the woman, saying, “Why do you trouble the woman? She has performed a good service for me. For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me.”

It may sound like Jesus is only siding with the woman. I've even heard people suggest that Jesus was saying that helping the poor isn't very important because we'll never solve the problem anyway. However, I believe that Jesus was actually supporting a both/and approach to our worship and work as people of faith.

There are times that call for extravagant acts of worship. Some things, like the last days of Jesus' life, actually are momentous. Expensive perfume is appropriate for those days.

We also need to remember that when Jesus told the disciples that the poor would always be with them, he was likely referring back to the passage from Deuteronomy 15:11 that observes that there will always be people in need on the earth, and God always expects people of faith to do something about that. Expensive perfume is important for the extraordinary moments, and the work of empowering and providing for those in need is appropriate in every moment.

A few things will change on January 1, 2026, but most of our worship and work as Christians will not. The year ticking over to a new number provides a reminder to plan for our ordinary work that needs to keep going and growing. Across the scriptures God calls people of faith to be good stewards of the earth, loving to all of our neighbors, faithful worshippers, workers for justice, extenders of care and empowerment to those in need, and much more. These expectations don't change with the seasons or the year. The needs and expectations will always be with us. They are a part of our faith-work.

As the new year begins, take a few moments to prayerfully consider God's everyday expectations.







Church Conference (also known as Charge Conference) is an annual meeting where we vote on the budget, approve nominations for committees and connect with the district superintendent of the Northern Illinois Conference. This year, we heard a message from Bishop Dan Schwerin, asking us to consider our focus for the year to be “practicing hope.” Our next Church Conference will most likely be in November 2026. All are welcome to attend, and Gary Church members are invited to vote.






Fired Up Musical


