1 Corinthians 16:14 Stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong. Let all that you do be done in love."



It seems appropriate that my final Chimes letter introducing this year's theme, "Love courageously," is based on the Apostle Paul's first letter, final message to the church in 1 Corinthians.

When I responded to God's call on my life as a teenager, I made a personal faith commitment

rooted in an understanding of God's love for me. Not just God's love for the world, but for me-Chris. As I grew in faith, I became increasingly more aware of the much broader and inclusive understanding of God's love found in the Gospel of John, "For God so loved the world that he gave

his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). And, I became increasingly aware that to return that love to God is a lifelong commitment, not just a one-time decision.

When Jesus spoke of loving God, he said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets" (Matthew 22:37-39).

Each time we think we have a grasp on "love," we find Christ's words, and the nudging of the Holy Spirit, beckoning us to expand our understanding of love, to expand our understanding of neighbor (Luke 10:29ff.). It oftentimes means loving people outside of our comfort zone, and even loving one's enemies (Matthew 5:43-48). This is what God's love looks like; it is love in action.

These texts, among others, have shaped how I have tried to live my life as a Christian, though I fail constantly. And they have formed my teaching and preaching throughout the years, though I have failed at that too.

To be clear, this is normative Christianity. It is central to the Good News of Jesus Christ. It is this love that led Jesus to his cross, that he might reconcile the world to God and us to one another. However, while this understanding of love is at the heart of our Christian faith, it is often rejected, even by the church. We find ways to create divisions, to draw circles smaller and tighter. When we do this, we choke off the very lifeblood of our faith.

It takes boldness, and courage to love God's way. God shows love to the evil and the good, the righteous and the unrighteous. Within God's love is also an understanding that God's love for us calls us to account. God's love is rooted in justice and is restorative. God's love is inseparable from God's mercy and grace. What does the Lord require of you? To do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly before God (Micah 6:6-8).

Truth be told, I am not always courageous and strong. Everything I do, it's not done in love. I fail. We all do. Yet, I believe this is what God demands of us as Christians. It is increasingly difficult to "do everything in love," in our current culture of chaos and division that rewards partisanship, exclusion and individualism. Hate, it seems has a certain heft to it. While love, for too many, is seen as weak or ineffectual.

Yet, it is God's way of love, upon which I have wagered my life. While I have often failed, this understanding of love has never failed me. God has never failed me.

As I take my leave as senior pastor of Gary Church, I pray that you will be able to acknowledge my shortcomings and failures, as I do. I pray that you will strive to love courageously, even those who the world encourages us to hate. I pray that you will love with a holy boldness, a love that stretches you to grow more and more into that divine love of mercy and grace. I pray that you will not let our current

climate of partisan politics divide you within the body of Christ. I pray that you will be gracious with one another. I pray that you will find a way to stand firm in the faith, yet with an attitude of theological humility. Let all that you do be done in love.

And now, may the grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be

with all of you in Christ Jesus.

Pastor Chris's final Sunday

Pastor Chris's last Sunday in worship with us will be Sept. 14. We will have one service at 9 a.m. with a retirement celebration in honor of Pastor Chris at 10 a.m. If you would like to contribute to a love gift, go to garychurch.org or give through the Church Office.

Welcome Rev. Dr. Mary Zajac

The Rev. Dr. Mary Zajac will serve as a transitional senior pastor from Oct. 1 until July 2026. Be sure to introduce yourself to Pastor Mary, wear your nametag, and welcome her during this transition time. Watch the e-news for more details about her first days. The bishop and cabinet will appoint our next senior pastor to start on July 1, 2026.

Clarifying the appointment process

In alignment with long-standing practice in The United Methodist Church, associate pastors are not appointed as senior pastors within the same congregation. This tradition, rooted in the denomination's connectional system, is intended to support both the growth of pastors and the health of congregations.

Congregational input sessions

The SPRC will create a pastoral profile to help guide the bishop and cabinet in their discernment of our next senior pastor. The SPRC will host two congregational input sessions during the 10 a.m. hour on the following Sundays:

Sept. 28 & Oct. 5

The feedback you provide will help create the pastoral profile we will share with District Superintendent Rev. Wendy Hardin Hermann during the November Annual Conference meeting. While this profile will help inform and guide the bishop and cabinet, the final decision rests with them, not with the SPRC or the congregation.

Inspiring the next generation

Native American women face immense, interconnected challenges in education. Cultural, political and systemic barriers limit their representation in higher education to less than 1%

of college enrollments. This reality makes success stories like Educate a Girl scholarship recipient Aaliyah Begay's worth celebrating.

Aaliyah, of Navajo/Santo Domingo Pueblo descent, is studying advertising at Columbia College Chicago. She is an outstanding scholar and an award-winning Indigenous dancer. The Begay Family Dance Company performed at Gary Church last October.

very empowering; it shows the world that the Indigenous community is still here, and we will become educated and do whatever it takes to educate the world," Aaliyah shared.

Being an Indigenous woman in college has come with unexpected pride and inspiration. Asliyah explained, "People were so interested in me. I've actually become *more* passionate about my culture. I feel seen."

Driven by a mission "to empower girls and young women through scholarships, prayers and love", Gary Church has awarded scholarships to 22 girls and young women over the past five years — donating \$14,000 to support the program this year alone. In Review: Annual Conference

Seven representatives from Gary Church joined **Pastor Daniel Cochran** at the 186th session of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference (NIC) this summer, which revolved around the theme, "Grace is Sufficient." The following report offers the compiled reflections of our representatives:


Our group was impressed by the diversity of our Conference and of the support in active ministry.



Bishop Dan Schwerin offered strong, calm and compassionate leadership – he was "the epitome of grace" (**Steve Novy**). We appreciated the efficiency and civility with which this year's legislation was discussed. One piece of legislation which required more discussion from the Conference floor was the new formula for calculating apportionments. After some debate, a new simplified formula was adopted that will ask larger churches to pay more than smaller churches. Here are some of the other highlights of the conference:

- Bishop Oliveto, the first openly gay bishop in The UMC, delivered a reflection during the ordination service, challenging us to "offer our hands" in service.
- Bishop Schwerin's Episcopal Address encouraged "experimentation in ministry," willing to risk new initiatives as we walk in faith: he said, "Faith is the courage to let grace do its work."
- Lay Leader Eugene Williams (retired Chicago police officer) offered the Lay Leader address, saying, "We as United Methodist know who we are and whose we are."
- The Bible Study led by Dr. Reginald Blount focused on the theme, "Grace is not Plan B for when things go wrong. Grace IS the Plan!"
- Retiring Pastor Kyunghae Anna Shin advised the church to "love more; fear less."

The overall feeling of this conference was that a burden had been lifted after years of divisiveness. We talked about our Methodist "connectionalism" with other churches and how we might enhance this relationship. One way is through serving on conference committees: there are openings for nominations to serve at the conference level on the new Creation Care committee as well as the District Committee on Ordained Ministry (see **Pastor Daniel Cochran** for more details.)





If you would like to view or print your statement, simply click "Statement" at the top of the page and select the desired parameters (i.e. year to date or last quarter), and it will download.

You can view your giving using the app: Church by MinistryOne. Download the app. Log in under the "Profile" feature. Once logged in, click "Giving" and then "History" to view your gifts to date.


