STATE OF THE CHURCH

In July of last year we began a new phase in our ministry here at Calvary Baptist Church which I entitled Initiative 1:8. The purpose behind Initiative 1:8 came from the verse in Acts from which it is named. In Acts 1:8 Jesus tell his disciples this: "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in 🏓 all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." With this as our battle cry we embarked on a mission with our focus on evangelism and discipleship to reach the world for Christ beginning in Gainesville and reaching to the ends of the earth. I wanted to take this opportunity to give you an 🥼 update on where we are at with our Initiative 1:8 program.

Locally, when we started Initiative 1:8 we began a visitation ministry with the goal to share Christ with our neighbors and invite them to our church. Since beginning this visitation, a dedicated group of members has met on Tuesday mornings and knocked on 108 doors in our community with the purpose of sharing

Christ and inviting them to church. We have seen several lives touched and even some visitors because of our efforts to reach our community in this manner. Also, within the local phase of Initiative 1:8, we began to focus inwardly on our discipleship. A small group has gathered faithfully each week to be trained in discipleship and has been sent out to begin other small discipleship groups within the church.

Financially we have also made some good strides within Initiative 1:8 as well. Our goal is to give up to 3% of our annual budget to our state convention which will have a huge impact on state, national, and international missions. This year we will give .5% of our 2018 budget towards these missions, which is up from .25% from last year. Also, through your giving to Initiative 1:8 we have given \$500 to the Mary Hill Davis Missions and \$900 to Lottie Moon Missions.

Finally, we have put together a Missions Committee who will help designate what our giving to each mission emphasis will be from Initiative 1:8. This committee will also work to find mission opportunities for Calvary locally as well as internationally. I am excited to see what Calvary has been able to do since taking on this endeavor and I am just as excited to see what else we will accomplish moving forward. I hope that you are equally excited about the impact Calvary is having not just here in Gainesville but to the end of the earth. The next thing we should do is to ask ourselves, "What next?"
