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If you are unfamiliar with the history of the Christian Church and wish to learn more about the ways that God has been at work throughout time and around the world, I would recommend you start your learning journey with Bruce Shelley's, Church History in Plain Language. In college I devoured this work, now in its fifth edition, due to its conversational yet comprehensive treatment of the experiences of the people of God, beginning with the moments immediately following Jesus' crucifixion, up to today, even in a global perspective. Shelley, prior to his death, gave us a wonderful quote in Church History which helps to distinguish trust in Jesus from any other faith: "Christianity is the only major religion to have at its central event the humiliation of its God."

Christians have always been mocked for following a crucified Messiah. There exists graffiti etched in ancient stone from around the year 200 depicting a man praying to a donkeyheaded figure hanging on a cross, bearing the message in Greek, "Alexamenos worships [his] God". The shameful faith of Alexamenos was put on public display, as he absorbed the taunting and jeering of likely more than one abuser who could not fathom worshipping a failed Messiah. .The very term 'Christian' was invented as an insult, as it means 'little Christ', mocking the way that followers of Jesus just wouldn't stop talking about this Christ guy and what He apparently accomplished, or failed to accomplish.

Jesus did not fit the mold of any of the Messianic expectations of his day, and not just of the Jewish faith. Remember that Ceasar of Rome was called the Anointed of God, also. And Rome certainly didn't have any issues (at least for the time being) of staking out a claim for themselves. In fact, Rome had great expertise in putting down Messianic figures who encouraged ordinary people to rise up against Roman occupation (see the Maccabean revolution). They did install a puppet kings over the Jews, but they were largely a figurehead during the days of Jesus. Everyone knew where true power lay. So when Jesus claimed a kingdom not of this world, and inaugurated it with His death, most simply stopped listening.

Except the story wasn't over. I would love to invite you into a simple experience of Scripture reading this month - just slowly read through the book of



Acts in the New Testament. There's only twenty-eight chapters, so one a day ought to do you. But marvel at the beautiful simplicity of the message of the Gospel as it spread throughout the Ancient Near East.

"This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, "The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool." Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." (ESV, Acts 2:32-36)

David, and the political throne of the nation of Israel, could not contain the Messianic hope. Only Jesus the Christ ascended to the right hand of the father - and this only through the utterly humiliating, shameful, murderous crucifixion at the hands of sinners - was sufficient to refound the world order. This kind of upside-down absurd story propelled the Disciples and many others out from Jerusalem, throughout the known world including Africa, Europe and Eastern Asia.

Their retelling of this good news, that the Messiah has defeated death for us, could not be stopped, even as Paul carried it into the most influential spaces he could as he leveraged his privileges and abilities.

Pillar #3 Spiritual Formation

This is the third in a series, reviewing the four pillars of Brookdale's Vision. The Vision statement is: "Brookdale Church is called to bring the beauty of the gospel to the brokenness of life." We believe that Brookdale is called to proclaim, embody, and live out this gospel message in its <u>prayer</u>, its <u>worship</u>, its approach to <u>spiritual formation</u>, and its <u>mission</u>, our four pillars.

What is spiritual formation? It is spiritual transformation, being spiritual conformed to the image of Jesus (Romans 8:29). It is <u>not</u> behavior modification.

It goes deeper than just behavioral change. This is a change that takes place in our hearts-in our motivation, emotion, desires. In other words, our behaviors are ultimately driven by a <u>transformed</u> heart.

How does transformation of heart take place?

It is a process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of His holiness. It is carried out in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit and by the believer's commitment to place themselves before God, through the means of Spiritual formation so He can transform us.

What are the means of spiritual formation to which Brookdale is committed?

- 1) Encourage the development of a consistent, habitual practice of the spiritual disciplines including but not limited to:
 - a) Meditation, study, memorization of scripture
 - b) Praver
 - c) Self-exam and application of truths
- 2) Encourage participation in the corporate disciplines of:
 - a) Worship
 - b) Guidance
 - c) Celebration
- 3) Provide discipling opportunities with include:
 - a) Education of adults, youth, and children
 - b) Small groups and 1 on 1 discipling
 - c) Ministries: Men's Women's, and Seniors
 - d) Bible studies
 - e) Caring and connection, celebration, service, mission

We see Brookdale as a place where people can struggle honestly, experience grace, and discover how the Beauty of the gospel can transform every area of their lives. Quoting Rev. Bryan Gregory, "As a church we desire to be a gospel shaped people who are continually being changed into the image of Jesus...deep, lasting change in our lives."

His followers were committed to submitting all of their lives to making much of Him, even if it meant being mocked as "little Christs" who had nothing else to talk about. Everywhere became a place to share the Gospel - beginning in small house churches where families in a neighborhood would gather together, around synagogues as followers of the Way explained how Jesus fulfilled the Scriptures, in the marketplace as spending habits changed and generosity became the order of the day for these Christians, and yes some who found themselves with influence in civil spaces even spoke about Jesus and His Kingdom to their coworkers and leaders.

How will you proclaim the victory of Jesus over death with your spouse, children, parents, and siblings? With your neighbors? With your coworkers, employees and supervisors? With your teammates and coaches? With your teachers and students? Friends and enemies? Strangers, in person and online? Where will you take the news of Jesus, Lord and Christ? Where does He call you to go?
