In June, I had the opportunity to go on a mission trip to South Dakota with the rest of the vouth from Brookdale. I can honestly say that this was one of the best weeks of my life and I could without a doubt write an entire book about it, but I'll try to keep this fairly short. During the long car ride to South Dakota, we found various ways to keep ourselves entertained including sleeping, making bracelets, talking to each other, playing the license plate game, and of course singing and blasting music. We stopped in Sioux Falls, where we got to walk around and look at the beautiful waterfalls. Unfortunately, while we were there, Xavier lost a shoe so we had to make a pit stop at a store to get him a new pair. That night, we stayed in Murdo, South Dakota where we swam and fit 15 people into the



small hotel hot tub. The next day we got to see the beauty of the Badlands. We also visited Wall Drug and spent some time in downtown Rapid City before going to the church we were residing in for the week. My sleeping room had 13 girls packed inches apart from each other so every night was like a giant slumber party. We often repeated the phrase "let's get squishy" throughout the week because of the number of times we had to squeeze together due to the amount of people. For our week of work, they split the 3 churches into 6 groups: the bison, bears, wolves, skunks, turtles, and elk. David, Grace, Xavier, and I were a part of the bison crew along with 4 kids and 2 adult leaders from a church in Littleton, Colorado. I, personally, was nervous about being with people I didn't know, but that fear quickly dissipated after the first day of working with them. The adult leaders, Patricia and Matt, and the kids, Brody, Mason, Jack, and Jessie, were incredibly fun and hard working. The bison traveled to 5 different work sites throughout the week including a camp, a community garden, a nursing home, a thrift store, and a therapeutic horse-riding center. For the first 2 work days, we were at the camp in the kitchen helping to make food and wash dishes for 300 campers. We made many desserts including cake, cookies, banana bread, and brownies and we helped prepare fruits, vegetables, side dishes, and main entrees. Grace and I even cracked 200+ eggs each to prepare for breakfast the next day. For the third day of work, we went to a community prayer garden and a nursing home for the elderly and people with special needs. At the prayer garden, we met Ken who took care of and maintained the garden. He told us the story of the prayer garden and had us pull weeds and pick up trash. The nursing home had the biggest impact on me personally. I got to talk to the residents there and hear their individual stories. I specifically remember a woman named Mary Lou who was touched by our company and expressed her joy through tears. Some of us also delivered mail to the rooms and got to experience the joy on their faces when they realized it was for them. The residents don't get to see new faces often so getting to go spend time with them was very special. For our last day of work, we went to a thrift store, and a therapeutic riding center. At the thrift store we pulled weeds and picked up trash around the building and sorted through donated items. Our last service site was a ranch that gives people with special needs the opportunity to ride horses in a calm and comfortable environment as a form of therapy. One of their storage buildings was in need of a new paint job and they recently had white paint donated to them so we gave the building a fresh coat of white paint. When we were done painting we got to feed the horses and meet Chuck Norris the cat and Rubar the mule. Continue on page 3...

#### **Announcement Guidelines**

#### PURPOSE:

1. To encourage participation in church ministry events by announcing the details of the activities prior to the worship service.

- 2. To provide equal opportunities for all ministries to announce upcoming events.
- 3. To protect worship time.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

- 1. The announcement pertains to a specific, timely event relevant to the ministries of the church.
- 2. The announcement should ideally not exceed two minutes.
- 3. If a ministry desires to make their own announcement, we ask that it be coordinated with the office administrator by Monday. Ideally only one person, in addition to the elder/staff person will be making announcements to protect worship time.
- 4. If persons wish to highlight a ministry, mission, missionary, or other significant event that warrants more than 2 minutes, please plan as far in advance as possible, coordinating with the office administrator. This will allow for adequate planning by the worship team.

#### PROCEDURE:

- 1. Contact the office administrator by Monday or earlier to schedule announcements.
- 2. If the announcement request falls outside of the guidelines or there are conflicting requests, the worship team will be consulted. The office administrator will then notify all parties of the worship team's recommendations.
- 3. Please avoid requesting announcement time on Sunday.


