It has long taken root and in this winter I pray God is getting Brookdale ready for the warmer months, resting us now and healing our hurts and disappointments, recovering and restoring everyone for a blooming, bold emergence in the Spring. Be reconciled to God and one another, make peace and ask the Lord how to be prepared for His revelation and renewal. Lord, guide us and keep us by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Bobby Larimore will be teaching Revelation




The Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, February 4, 2024. Session will organize the meal and the programming. Time to be determined.
