The Crucifixion: Who won? (Sequel to "God-Likeness")

"The expression of Christian character is NOT good-doing but God-likeness. How does the transformation into God-likeness in sinful man take place? The Spirit of God, received at the moment of salvation, transforms you within so that you will exhibit "Divine" characteristics in your life, not "good human" characteristics.

How is the Spirit of God present in our lives? When we believe that Jesus died on the cross for us, when He becomes our Lord, we receive the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit transforms us and it starts with the cross.

We believe:

- The cross did not HAPPEN to Jesus. He came on purpose for it "the lamb slain from the foundation of the world." (Rev. 13:8); prophesies in the O.T. were fulfilled, i.e., "no bones were broken" (Ps. 24:20) and "his side will be pierced." (Zec. 12:10-14)
- 2. He made a way for every son of man to come into communion with God;
- 3. Jesus is God manifest in the flesh and the Son who became sin. God became incarnate (flesh) for the purpose of putting away sin;
- 4. The cross was a "superb triumph" in which the foundations of hell were shaken. Then "Jesus said, It is finished. With that He bowed His head and gave up His Spirit." (Jo.19:30)

Who won? We won! "Jesus bore our sins in His own body on the tree. By His wounds, we were healed." (2 Pe .2:24)

Jesus was not a good man who was helplessly mistreated and killed by those nasty Romans and Jews. The cross is not the cross of a man, but the Cross of God. . . the gateway by which any individual can enter into union with God. . . we abide in the life to which the cross is the gateway.

No wonder there are crosses in sanctuaries of worship, around peoples' necks, and on tombstones. No wonder the cross is an offense to the enemies of God.

As a result of the cross, transformation into "God-likeness" can take place? Next month - How the Holy Spirit makes "God-likeness" possible in the life of a believer.
