"GOD WILL BLESS YOUR CRISIS," PART II

JOHN 20:19-31
3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Our Sermon on Sunday was "God Will Bless Your Crisis," Part II, and the Scripture was John 20:19-31. After Easter morning, the disciples are locked away in fear. The risen Jesus steps into their locked room, bestowing peace, joy, and the Holy Spirit and commissioning them—no barrier can keep Him out. Part II of the sermon focused on the breath of the Holy Spirit and on Thomas, reminding us that it is the Holy Spirit who enables us to do all things in Christ and then on Thomas—that doubt is not a dead end but a doorway to deeper faith.

Point 2: Creation and Commission: The Divine Breath

Genesis tells us that God formed Adam from the earth and breathed life into him (Genesis 2:7). The action is profound: God shapes man from the dust and breathes into him, transforming him into a living soul. This is more than physical life; it's spiritual vitality—God's own Spirit, bringing humanity to life. This happens just before Adam is placed in the Garden of Eden. When Jesus appears to His disciples after the resurrection, He breathes on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." Just as God's breath gave life to Adam, Jesus' Spirit empowers His followers to carry on His work. This wasn't about puffed-up arrogance and authority, but as a mission to make God's love, forgiveness, and truth known to the world, offering others the same renewal. How do we know Jesus had already forgiven Peter and the other disciples who had abandoned Him? Even after Peter had declared three times that he would never deny Jesus, Jesus didn't show up and say, "Peter, you did exactly what you said you wouldn't do." I'm gonna remind you over and over of your failure, your short comment, no, he didn't – he sent him along with a purpose. Now, this is one example of Jesus, not calling someone out on their behaviors, their shortcomings – we can't just take this one incident and use it for all patterns of addressing issues. There were times when Jesus did address issues that were not becoming, unkind, untoward, manipulative, and unjust, especially with those in leadership and those who abused and scoffed at the marginalized.

God Sends Us Out with Purpose

Jesus shows His wounds as proof of His resurrection, then commissions the disciples: "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." He breathes the Holy Spirit on them, empowering them to move beyond fear into God's purpose. Our crises do not disqualify us—instead, God uses them to send us out as witnesses of hope. Even our worst moments can become the starting point for new hope and calling. God will take our pain and repurpose it for our healing, His mission, and His purpose for our lives and winning souls for Christ. We just have to trust the process.

Point 3: Doubt Is Not a Dead End (Thomas' Story)

Thomas wasn't present when Jesus first appeared on Resurrection Sunday—maybe he was deep in grief, grief-angry, or tending to family matters and just couldn't bring himself to be with the others. We don't know, but he did show up within a week of Easter morning. Thomas often gets only the negative descriptor as "Doubting Thomas," but he can also be called "Honest Thomas." We could be more than one thing at the same time. I think our emotions, situations, and conditions could change us. Jesus didn't give Thomas the name "Doubting Thomas"; he just said that his actions were doubting. We do not have to be defined by one situation in our lives. And we don't have to let others define us by one decision or a failure. But if we have a pattern of doubt, poor behavior, and bad decisions, do something about it—fix it—change it for the better. In fact, earlier in John's Gospel, Thomas was the one who said, "Let's go with Jesus, even if it means dying with Him" (John 11:16). He was the one who wasn't afraid to say, "Lord, we don't know where you're going—how can we know the way?" (John 14:5). Thomas was mostly loyal, real, and raw about his confusion.

That's real life, isn't it? We can feel more than one thing at a time—doubt and faith, grief and hope, confusion and loyalty. Sometimes, our obligations, expectations, hurt feelings, trauma, and inability to cope with bad decisions or irrational thinking pull us away from where we think we should be, but it's not a dead end. When Thomas finally encounters Jesus, Jesus doesn't shame him. Instead, Jesus gives Thomas what he needs: a personal invitation to touch His wounds and see for himself. Thomas responds with one of the greatest confessions in the Bible: "My Lord and my God!"

How do I know if we can take on characteristics depending on where we are in life and how emotional our conditions are? I've just mentioned Thomas's behavior in John 11:16 and John 14:5. However, when our characters are antithetical to God and the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23), we need to change them. Definitive patterns are true behavior. Let's do better and not just say, "That's just how I am." Others are impacted by our behavior—your family, friends, co-workers, church, and, ultimately, our faith walk should resemble Christ. As believers, our lives may be the only Bible that non-believers read or that struggling believers read, depending on whatever is going on in their lives. Be the pages of the Bible of encouragement—continue to grow spiritually, mentally, behaviorally, and in deeds.

However, in this moment of our sermon text, he wanted what we often want to see: forensic evidence of Jesus' crucifixion—the nail print in his hand and the pierced side (metaphorically in our modern-day situation). Thomas wanted to look further, actually wanting to touch both, but the disciples earlier didn't ask Jesus to show them this evidence—Jesus offered, and then they were overjoyed, which tells me there was some unbelief.

Thomas' doubt didn't earn him the same blessing that Jesus bestowed upon the disciples. We often want to see Jesus—we want the evidence—the lack of faith (Hebrews 11:1)—especially in our crisis. The wounds were reminders of suffering—but ultimately they were proof that God's grace and power triumph over tragedy.

Thomas' lack of belief wasn't scolded by Jesus. He appears again to the disciples. He meets him where he is, inviting him to see and believe. Jesus already knew his thoughts of unbelief. He also knows what's in our hearts and our thoughts—we can't hide them from him even if we don't speak them out loud. Thomas' confession, "My Lord and my God!" is a testimony that honest doubts can lead to revelations and living out our faith—it's the spiritual transformation that we experience. It's not about where we've been, but where we are and where we're going. It is the love of Christ, the betterment of ourselves, and the mission of Christ.

Jesus is still willing to bless us, even in our delays of receiving him. Faith means believing without seeing, but it also means hoping that everything will work out according to God's will for our situations and lives. That's what it means for us today. Our faith journey might include questions and struggles, but Jesus welcomes us, offers peace, and invites us to trust. When life falls apart, it can feel like you're stuck in a padded cage—comfortable in places, ideologies, perspectives, and affiliations that are not for our good, but we've settled in it because it's a comfort of a padded place given a false sense of convenience and softness that actually brings discomfort and assurance; however, these are places often without God that are a trap by fear—trapped by fear, disappointment, doubt, and past hurts. Sometimes, we even lock Jesus out, thinking no one or he can reach us in that place. The disciples knew that feeling. On Easter evening, they were huddled together behind locked doors, paralyzed by fear. Our own walls can't keep Jesus out if we're open to change and transformation—sometimes we have to invite Him in. Even our worst crises can become the starting point for new hope and calling. Our pain is wasted with God; He repurposes it.

Thomas: Legacy

Thomas is listed among the twelve disciples in all the Gospels and Acts. In John 11, he shows bold loyalty ("Let us also go, that we may die with him"). In John 14, he asks honest questions at the Last Supper. After the resurrection, he doubts, but when Jesus appears, Thomas's journey from skepticism to faith turns into his powerful declaration, "My Lord and my God!" So, let's reconsider the moniker "doubting Thomas" and add to it "honest Thomas." We all should look beyond the "one moments" in our lives as the "defining" moment.

God will bless your crisis, speak peace to our fear, breathe the Holy Spirit into us, send us out with purpose, and meet us in our doubts. Whatever crisis you face, trust that God can bless it—turning fear into faith and doubt into trust and empowerment. Thomas's story shows us that doubt isn't the end; it's often the place where real faith begins. God is always in the business of makeovers—turning locked doors into open invitations and our lowest moments into places of blessing and new life.

Reflection:

What area of your life needs Jesus' assurance and peace today? Invite Him in—He is not afraid of your locked doors or your honest questions. Like Thomas, bring all of yourself—your faith, your doubts, and your questions—to the One who meets you right where you are. Thomas' story reminds us doubt isn't a dead end. God meets us in our questions, our locked rooms, even our padded cages. He brings peace, offers purpose, and gives us a faith that's honest and alive. God is always in the business of makeovers—turning locked doors into open invitations and our lowest moments into places of blessing and new life.
