#### "WHEN THE DUST SETTLES," PART II

In our recent sermon, we continued in the text of Luke 10:1-11, 16-20, where Jesus sends out the seventy-two disciples to spread the gospel. This mission emphasizes not only the urgency of sharing God's love but also the inherent dangers of venturing into a world that may not readily accept their message. Jesus prepares His disciples by instructing them to travel light, taking no baggage with them (Luke 10:4). This teaching serves as a reminder that carrying excess weight—whether material or emotional—can hinder our effectiveness in our calling. By sending them out in pairs, He provides not only protection but also companionship, ensuring they can support one another through the challenges they may encounter (Luke 10:1).

Last week, we celebrated our annual Vacation Bible School, ending in an exciting weekend finale at Urban Air. This event was not just an outing; it also illustrated the mission Jesus entrusted to His followers. One of the key lessons from our VBS study was from Mark, emphasizing how Jesus welcomed children and said, "Let the little children come to me" (Mark 10:14). Our children are important. As they navigated Urban Air in group teams with adult chaperones for safety, we were reminded of the importance of community in our spiritual journeys. Just as the disciples were sent out in pairs for protection and encouragement, our kids experienced the joy of fellowship and safety.

We also engaged in evangelism and shared kindness with those who served us at the outing. While the ministry was received in the peace it was given, Jesus warns that we will sometimes face rejection (Luke 10:16), knowing that we all would have challenges, just as He faced opposition from the Pharisees, Sadducees, and governmental rulers—figures of authority who challenged His message. We must be prepared for that reality as well. Therefore, it is vital to have ministry buddies—prayer buddies, spiritual battle buddies, accountability buddies, worship buddies, etc.—just as the people of Israel did during the time of Joshua (Joshua 6). They walked around the walls of Jericho for six days, and on the seventh day, the walls fell. This shows the power of building community and partnership and the activation of God's power through daily practices of worship and obedience to His instructions.

The sermon also highlighted the activation of the Holy Spirit in our lives. I likened salvation to a gift card given to us freely—an incredible blessing that requires activation to hold any value. Just as a gift card must be activated to unlock its purchasing and redemption power, our relationship with Christ calls us to engage actively with the Holy Spirit (Luke 10:19). Through prayer, study, and worship, we activate that power, allowing us to heal and perform miraculous works in Jesus' name. This mission is not solely about the acts we perform but about knowing God intimately and rejoicing that our names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life (Revelation 21:27).

As we walk our spiritual paths, we grow our awareness through spiritual disciplines. Regular prayer, devotion, fasting, and worship anchor us in our faith and help us discern when we are aligned with God's purpose (Luke 10:20). These practices keep us grounded, reminding us of the importance of being together in community. When we support one another, we can navigate our challenges with courage and faith, ultimately fulfilling the mission, our visions, and our call that God has set before us, creating new stories and fresh anointing. In this journey, may we always remember that while the road may be paved with difficulties, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to conquer every obstacle.
