"The Appointment You Can't Afford to Miss!" Part I

In last week's sermon, from Luke 11:1-13, we explored the significance of prayer, titled "The Appointment You Can't Afford to Miss!" The passage begins with a disciple approaching Jesus with a heartfelt request: "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1 NIV). The context is crucial, reflecting the disciples' realization that their spiritual lives must be prioritized, much like Martha's experience when Jesus gently rebukes her for focusing on work instead of sitting at His feet to listen (Luke 10:41-42). This interaction highlights that our relationship with Jesus and our prayer life are foundational and must take precedence over all else.

Focus 1: The Pattern and Privilege of Prayer:

The Appointment (v. 1): An appointment is a dedicated time set aside for a specific purpose. Jesus demonstrates this by rising early in the morning to pray (Mark 1:35), illustrating that prayer is not merely a ritualistic act but a vital engagement with our Creator. The disciples' plea for Jesus to teach them how to pray reveals their desire to connect with God profoundly. Notably, they did not ask to pray like Jesus did, but, rather as John's disciples, indicating their understanding of their position as learners under God's chosen leaders. This points to a key spiritual revelation: while they recognized the depth and authority of Jesus' prayers, they sought to learn how to pray in a manner that reflected their role as His followers of the Master Leader. They understood that their prayers needed to align with the example set by Jesus, who modeled a relationship with God that was both intimate and powerful.

Provision (v. 2): When Jesus instructs His disciples to pray for "daily bread," He emphasizes not only the need for physical sustenance but also our spiritual dependence on God for all our needs. This call to seek "daily bread" recalls the experience of the Israelites in the Exodus narrative, where God provided manna each day in the wilderness, teaching them to rely on Him for their daily provisions (Exodus 16:4-5). They were instructed to gather only enough for that day, reinforcing their dependence on God. In contrast, our modern culture—unlike the crisis faced by the Israelites in the wilderness—often encourages us to stockpile food for weeks, giving a sense of self-sufficiency that metaphorically reflects our tendency to forget to seek God daily in prayer for our needs. However, the emphasis on praying for daily bread invites us to approach God regularly, acknowledging that He is the source of everything we require, both materially and spiritually. This dependence encourages us to cultivate a consistent prayer life, bringing our needs before God and trusting in His provision and guidance in every aspect of our lives.

The Condition (vv. 3-4): Furthermore, Jesus recognizes the sinful nature of our lives and the importance of forgiveness in our prayers (Matthew 6:14-15). We understand what sin is by studying our Bibles, engaging with the accountability of the Christian community, and seeking God in prayer for exposure, clarity, and correction. He instructs us to seek forgiveness for our sins while also calling us to forgive those who have wronged us. This reciprocal nature of forgiveness is vital for healing our relationships with others and ourselves, reinforcing that our spiritual health is intertwined with how we interact with those around us. Additionally, Jesus warns us to pray for deliverance from evil, acknowledging the constant presence of temptation in our lives. In James 1:13, we are reminded that God does not lead us into temptation, but He will surely come to our aid when we recognize our behavior and vulnerability to sin, confess, and repent—praying and seeking His guidance in overcoming it.

Intentional Preparation: As we engage in prayer, let's approach it with intention, much like preparing for a doctor's appointment where we come with our questions and concerns, ready for the best practice. The practice of prayer that Jesus teaches begins with a pattern of adoration of God, provision, condition, and preparation. This practice of prayer is not just an obligation but a privilege—a divine appointment that we must not miss. By seeking God through prayer, we open ourselves to divine wisdom and strength for our daily challenges. The disciples' request for guidance on prayer reflects their understanding of Jesus' authority and spiritual depth. By following His teachings, we gain a complete approach to prayer that nurtures our connection with God, acknowledges our shortcomings, and encourages us to extend grace to others.

Strengthening the Core: Ultimately, "The Appointment You Can't Afford to Miss" reminds us that prayer should be at the core of our lives. It is through this sacred practice that we deepen our relationship with God, receive His guidance, and face life's challenges with faith and resilience. Let us embrace this appointment with God early in the morning and every day, recognizing its importance in our spiritual journey and the transformative power it holds for our lives.
