"Why Be Healed with 'Them'?"

Sunday's message was from Luke 13:10-17, Sermon Title, "Why Be Healed with "Them'?" This story unfolds in a synagogue, where Jesus, a visiting preacher, steps into a tense atmosphere filled with expectation and hypocrisy. He confronts the rigid mindset of the religious leader who prioritizes rules over compassion. In the midst of this, a woman who has been bent over for eighteen long years boldly steps forward, refusing to let fear hold her back. She doesn't allow fear—the "false evidence appearing real"—to stop her from moving in faith. Instead, in faith, she moves "forward, assured, inspired, transformed, and healed."

So, why heal in front of them? Jesus demonstrates that healing isn't just a personal journey; it's a public affirmation of God's power and grace. Psalm 23:5, "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." This powerful act of saving grace serves as a reminder that God's blessings are abundant, even in the face of opposition.

In this scene, the synagogue leader is furious, and apparently some others—as Jesus calls them "hypocrites"—are upset by Jesus' boldness in healing her on the Sabbath, misusing the true purpose of the Sabbath. Jesus calls out their hypocrisy, letting them know how they've missed the heart of love and healing by clinging to the misinterpretation of the text and how all need healthcare (Ex. 20:8-9; Mk. 2:27).

Imagine the woman sitting in the back, her body bent over, only able to see her shoes, unable to see the faces of those around her. For eighteen years, she has lived in pain, with her spine fused and her life severely limited. Picture her struggles: countless doctor visits, the financial burden of treatments, and the longing for simple joys like walking in the park or actively meeting with friends. Eighteen years of missed opportunities and isolation—this isn't just a physical condition; it's a deep emotional wound.

As preachers, we are called to speak boldly, ensuring the message reaches even those in the "back and the balconies". And as believers, we are called to connect with our community, lifting each other up and sharing the hope of healing. Jesus exemplified this when He called the woman forward with authority and compassion. He didn't whisper; He proclaimed her healing loud and unashamedly. "Woman, you are set free from your infirmity!" (Lk. 13:12) He declared, drawing the attention of everyone present. In that moment, He wasn't just addressing her physical state but calling out the pain that many of us know all too well—our own "eighteen years" of hurt, loss, health issues, financial struggles, and broken relationships.

We can relate to her story in our everyday lives. Maybe you've dealt with trauma that feels like it's holding you back from your true potential. Perhaps you've faced overwhelming financial struggles or health concerns that keep you from fully engaging with life. Just like the woman, we often find ourselves bent over by the burdens of our past and present, unable to look up and see the better days ahead.

But here's the good news: Jesus sees us and calls us forward, not in shame but in love, inviting us into a healing that is communal and transformative. Just as He healed the woman in front of the congregation, we're reminded that our healing journeys are interconnected. As we come together in faith, we can support one another, lifting each other up and embracing the healing power of community.

Let's not forget that Jesus had His roots in Nazareth, a place often questioned with the disdainful phrase, opposing Jesus, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46). Yet, it was from that very place that He brought forth His Nazareth "hood hand," showing strength and authority in confronting the synagogue leader and others for the hypocrisy they represented. That same "holy hand" reached out to the woman, bringing her healing and freedom. We can incorporate both strengths as long as they are in the Holy Spirit.

As we reflect on this message, let us not block our blessings with life's burdens but instead believe in the miracle of healing in Christ. He is with you and will stand in front of the burdens that hold you back. Let's be the kind of church that hears the cries of the hurting, reaching out with compassion and love. Together, we can experience the freedom that comes from being healed with "them," breaking the chains of our past and stepping into a future filled with hope and joy of the congregation of those who cheered!(Lk. 13:17)
