"A Call and Response"

As we continue our journey through the Gospel of Luke, we encounter powerful teachings from Jesus that challenge our understanding of authority, manipulation, and our responses to divine calls. Our sermon Sunday was from Luke 13:31-35, and our Sermon Title, "A Call and Response." Our Key Points:

Point 1: The Call Out - Facade of Advisorship (Luke 13:31-32):

When the Pharisees approach Jesus with a warning about Herod's intentions to kill Him, their message carries layers of manipulation and hypocrisy. They present themselves as concerned advisors, yet this reflects their ongoing opposition to Jesus. Their attempt to exert control over Him through fear is a classic example of how authority can be misused in manipulation pursued.

- Understanding Manipulation: Just as the Pharisees came to Jesus under the guise of concern, we must be cautious of those who present themselves as advisors but have ulterior motives. Their influence is rooted in "FEAR"—presenting Herod as a "fierce enemy appearing real" to manipulate and control. We must navigate these influences carefully, staying the course in our faith as Jesus did.
- -Recognizing Hypocrisy: Throughout His ministry, the Pharisees frequently challenged Jesus, revealing their pattern of opposition rather than genuine inquiry. They were closely tied to the governmental system, seeking status and power rather than the well-being of the people. Their concern was not for the truth but for maintaining their influence and authority. We also must check our lives and ask ourselves: Are we genuinely living a life that is holy and honoring to the Lord, or are we pretending? If our walk doesn't match the call of living a life that clings to the Lord, then we are just pretending. If we spend more time for people, selfish desires, and worldly ways than we have for worship and serving the Lord, we must repent and turn to God in spirit and in truth. (Matt. 7:21-23)
- Facing Opposition: Just as Jesus faced manipulation from those who should have been spiritual leaders, we too may encounter challenges from people around us. This demands courage and clarity in standing firm in our faith, especially when confronted with fear-based tactics. His Word gives us bold courage to stand on His business and ours He has for us.

Point 2: The Response: Communication and the "Clapback" (Luke 13:33):

Jesus stands firm on His determination to fulfill His purpose, stating that He will not be deterred by threats. He boldly asserts that no prophet can die outside Jerusalem, foreshadowing His own journey toward the cross. He declares His reinforcement and commitment to His mission, which is rooted in divine authority and purpose.

- -Commitment to Purpose: Jesus' steadfast focus on His mission shows His clarity about His identity and calling. He communicates so that there's no misunderstanding—His "no" is no, with a period not a comma or semi-colon it's declared and definitive. He responds to the call to leave with His own call. By calling Herod a "fox," He points to him as a weak leader—cunning but ultimately lacking the grandiose power he desired, ruling only over two regions: Galilee and Perea. Jesus' clarity and determination serve as powerful reminders that we must keep our eyes on God's call for our lives, even in the face of opposition, intimidation, and rejection. His spiritual examination, discernment, and clear communication contribute to effective conflict resolution.
- Clarity in Mission: His mission was clear, not clouded by confusion or fear. We should take time to reflect, pray, and read the Word to gain spiritual insight and clarity about our purpose daily. Jesus decreed and declared that He was healing and casting out demons. Demons may come into our presence with false authority and purpose, trying to intimidate us or make us feel inferior within ourselves and our structures, including the church—those structures that operate under godly practices, whether in this world or beyond. We must protect ourselves, both individually and corporately against these evil forces. (Eph. 6:10-20)
- Moving in Faith: Just as Jesus pressed on in His mission, we must evaluate our dedication to following God's call. Are **we actively pursuing our** relationship with Him, or are we allowing distractions or fears to hinder our progress? It's important to move forward in faith, as Jesus did, rather than staying stuck in fear.

Point 3: Lament and Consequences of Rejection (Luke 13:34-35):

Jesus expresses His desire to gather the people of Jerusalem under His protective wings, illustrating His longing to nurture them as the compassionate Shepherd who invites us into a personal relationship.

- God's Desire for Relationship: Jesus seeks to build trust, love, and faith with us to heal our brokenness and transform our lives.
- Rejecting Fear: The Pharisees tried to instill fear regarding Herod, but knowing our identity in Christ protects us from such deceptive influences.
- Invitation to Repentance: Jesus calls us to return to Him. Are we responding to His longing or allowing pride, external influences, and demonic forces to keep us away?

He pronounces judgment on Jerusalem, declaring their house will be desolate due to their rejection of Him, yet promises that future acknowledgment of Him as the Messiah will lead to restoration.

- Rejection to Examination: Jerusalem's desolation reminds us of the serious implications of turning away from God. We must remain receptive to His voice, recognizing that true acknowledgment brings hope and renewal.
- Hope in Acknowledgment: The promise of recognizing Jesus as the Messiah encourages us to embrace His presence and salvation.
- Living in Hope: Are you participating in His mission and anticipating the fulfillment of His promises? Let's acknowledge Jesus in our lives and share His love as we await His return

May we respond authentically to God's call, practice and develop spiritual discernment, strive for humility, and remain steadfast in our faith, honoring Jesus' mission and opening ourselves to His transformative power and purpose.
