In the Bible, the word “let” is a versatile term that can express **divine command**, **human permission**, **moral exhortation**, or even **God’s permissive will**. Its meaning depends on context, and in the original Hebrew and Greek texts, different words are translated as “let” in English, each with its own nuance.
