#### NEW ADULT CLASSES TO BEGIN

Understanding Racialization in America

Last fall, our church offered a five-session series on Race and Racism with outside speakers and suggested readings. Because there's still so much more to learn, Constance Strickland, Claudette Haney and I are organizing a class we're calling Understanding Racialization in America to read and engage in conversation around two important books: Black Fatigue by Mary-Frances Winters and Be the Bridge by Latasha Morrison starting on Wednesday, January 27 and continuing through Lent. (Note: this is a change from our original plan to start the class earlier in January).

Black Fatigue offers a factual perspective on the impact of racism on the health and well-being of Black Americans. Written by a business consultant and scholar in 2020, the material is concise and easy to read. We anticipate spending three Wednesdays (January 27, February 3 and 10) on this book. Be the Bridge offers a Christian perspective on racism; its subtitle is "Pursuing God's Heart for Racial Reconciliation." Prayers and liturgies are included in the reading, along with encouragement to "be the bridge" with others. If you have any questions, feel free to contact any of us.
