SERMON NOTES

Leviticus 19:33-34 - Loving the Stranger Sermon Series: *Time For Change* #8

Questions for family/small group discussions:

Two ways that we are to treat/relate to the stranger:

1. Do _____ to him/her.

d. Why is it so important for us to remember and embrace our identity as strangers (Lev. 19:34, Ex. 23:9)? How does this make a difference for our hearts and actions?
