SERMON NOTES

John 2:1-11 – What Are You Drinking?

Questions for family/small group discussions:

- 1. On a scale of 1-10, what is most commonly your level of joy? What is it that most often sucks the joy out of your heart/life?
- 2. When you read John 20:28-31 and John 2:11, what is the purpose of the miracle and story of our text in John 2?

Jesus reveals himself in two ways:

1. Tasted

a. Read Psalm 34:8. Many people believe in Jesus but there are few who taste, feast on, and delight in him. Is this your experience and when/how do you most truly delight in him?

b. Read Isaiah 25:6-8. How do the truths of this prophecy impact us today and give us hope for the future? Since Jesus is the Lord and Master of this great banquet feast, what does this say about who he is and what he is doing? What does it say about who we are and what we are to be doing?

2. Perfect ______

- a. Read John 15:9. Jesus knows you into the core of your being and yet sees you as stunningly beautiful and longs for you to come home as his bride. What are some ways that Jesus has demonstrated this love? How does this love change you, your relationships and your mission?
- b. Read Zeph. 3:14-17. What aspects of this prophecy are most striking to you? What does this text say about Christ's character and how does this impact your heart/life?
- c. Read John 4:10. What most often keeps us from asking for the drink that Jesus offers to us every day? What has been your experience in asking for and drinking in the gift that God extends to you?
- d. When you consider that we are "half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us" (C.S. Lewis), what are the most common substitutes that you depend on for your joy? Take some time for repentance.
- e. Read Psalm 16:11, Rev. 19:7. What is our ultimate source of joy? What is God's provision for carrying us until then?
