SERMON NOTES

Genesis 29:15-35 - Hope and Disappointment

Questions for family/small group discussions:

The stories of Jacob and Laban reveal a dysfunctional family mess. We all have some level of dysfunction in our immediate or extended family. What is some of that dysfunction and sin and how might God be working in the midst of it all?

We consider 6 lessons that are revealed in our story.

The Bad News...

1. Your sin will often come back to _____ you.

 When you consider Proverbs 13:15 and some of the ways that your sin has ricocheted to come back and hurt you, where have you most experienced sin's consequences and what could be some of the lessons from the pain?

2. There will always be deep ______.

- What have been some of your deepest disappointments in life and what made them so deep and painful? What have you learned through the disappointment?
- What things are most commonly offered up to us today that "when morning came," turn out to be "Leah"? (see Gen. 29:25)
 What might be the things you are most tempted to put your hope in today?

3. ______ of _____ will make your life worse.

- When you read Gen. 29:32 and 34, you can see how desperately Leah is looking for love, acceptance, and fulfillment through the love of her husband and children. What might be some evidences that your life could be revolving more around family than around Christ and his mission?
- How does our Western Michigan/Rockford subculture reinforce/encourage some idolatry of family? How could you repent and make some changes toward Christ as your supreme love and hope?

The Good News...

1. God works with _____ people.

• What is the great encouragement in seeing that God shows grace to those who resist, fail, and don't appreciate it? How have you seen this in your own life or in the lives of those around you?

2. God works _____ weak people.

• How did God ultimately use Leah for his great redemptive work for even us today? What does it mean for you when you see how God uses people like Jacob, Laban, and Leah? How might this change the way that you respond to some of the messy "sinful" family members, neighbors, and co-workers that you might otherwise turn away from?

3. God works _____ weak people.

• When you see the progression for Leah in Gen. 29:31-35—until she gives praise to God, can you see how God has worked IN you through various circumstances until you were rescued and employed for his great, redemptive work?

Jesus is the true ______.

- How do you see that Jesus gave up perfect beauty and love to become homely and rejected so that you, who deserve rejection, could be made beautiful and accepted? What does it mean for you to become truly beautiful and accepted? How does this change your endless search for hope, love, and fulfillment in the substitutes?
- How did Jesus give up all power to become weak so that you can have the power to overcome the ricochet of sin in your life? Take time to pray for the power of his Spirit to help you overcome specific sins and temptations.
- When you read Rev. 19:7, how does a constant looking forward to this day change and impact us?
