SERMON NOTES

Luke 14:25-35 - Alone in the Wind

Questions for family/small group discussions:

- 1. We reviewed some of the stories and texts, beginning with Luke 9:18-19 and up to our text in Luke 14. And then we noted that Jesus was constantly working to expand and correct a narrow and twisted view of himself and his kingdom. What has been one of your most significant corrections or better understandings of Jesus and his kingdom? What teaching or circumstances were important for your adjustment?
- 2. Jesus makes it clear that following him involves a cost and commitment. What part of the cost, commitment, or commandments do you most resist or struggle with and why? What are some ways that you may be sliding into the "easy, lowcost discipleship"?
- 3. Jesus said that we are to "hate" or love family less than him (14:26) and that "any of you who does not give up everything he has cannot be my disciple" (14:33). Who or what are the people or things that most easily become the substitute for Jesus? Or what might be the things or people that you most love, talk about, depend on, or find your identity in-more than Jesus?
- 4. We said that family was a possession that provided a Jew with status, salvation, and security. Who or what most easily becomes your status, salvation, or security? What do you have to believe or do to shift your "follow-Jesus" dependence from the substitutes to **Jesus himself?**

- 5. We noted that putting Jesus first in our love and dependence works to intensify our love for family. Referring to the quote below from C.S. Lewis, how does the gospel and loving Jesus supremely increase our love for family? What are some deeply absorbed gospel facets that enable you to love your family more deeply?
 - When I have learnt to love God better than my earthly dearest, I shall love my earthly dearest better than I do now. Insofar as I learn to love my earthly dearest at the expense of God and instead of God, I shall be moving towards the state in which I shall not love my earthly dearest at all. When first things are put first, second things are not *suppressed but increased.* —C. S. Lewis

6. The sermon stated that another way that our love and commitment to Jesus changes us is that our family is wonderfully expanded. The family of God is now the primary family where we are to love and nurture one another. "We live in the shelter of each other." How has this been important to you? What adjustments could you make so that you serve and are served with love and nurture in the family of God?

7. Read Psalm 68:5-6 – If this is who God is, and following Jesus means that we are to become like him, how should this guide and impact your life and ministry? What are some practical ways that you can act in this way?
