SERMON NOTES

John 3:29-31 - The Way Up is Down

Questions for family/small group discussions:

- 1. What are some examples of the ways that our culture encourages us to promote ourselves? How do we see self-promotion with sports, politics, social media, celebrities, and media? What are some examples of how you sometimes promote self? What are some factors that drive or motivate self-promotion? What might be some of the negative results from self-promotion?
- 2. When you consider John 3:29-30, what are some ways that you could become less and Jesus could become greater in your life? What are some ways that you might take attention away from Jesus and toward self?
- 3. Based on John 3:29, we see that when Jesus increases, our joy increases. Or the way up is actually down. How do you think that joy can come through trusting, obeying, sacrificing, serving others, and pointing to Jesus?


We see two ways that there can be joy in serving, sacrificing, and giving of your life to serve others and point to Jesus:

- 1. You see, believe, and embrace God's _____ and ____
 - 1. What does John 3:21 say about what God is doing and why is he doing it? What do John 3:27 and 30 say about what is our place in what God is doing in the world? On your typical day, does your joy most often come from your own small world—or from a constant sense of your place in what God is doing to gather many into his kingdom?
 - 2. What are some ways that friends have abandoned or used you? How does Jesus show himself to be a true friend?
 - 3. When you consider Isaiah 62:5, John 1:6-9, and 5:35, what is the bigger picture and plan of God and what is our place in that picture and plan?

- 2. You supremely _____ and ____ Jesus.
 - 1. What does John 1:29 say about Jesus' mission? And as you consider John's work here, what might that say about our mission?
 - 2. Read John 6:27. What are some ways that we "work for the food that perishes"? What things do you most often turn to in a search for love, acceptance, pleasure, affirmation, or status? How have you seen this search be a disappointment for others or your self? How can you find all of these things perfectly in Jesus?
 - 3. Read John 4:10. What is the key for receiving all that God offers us through Jesus?
 - 4. When we understand that through Jesus, we are both fully known and truly loved, how does that liberate us from pretense, humble us out of our self-righteousness, and fortify us for any difficulty life can throw at us? (from quote by Tim Keller)
 - 5. C.S. Lewis "Christian humility is not thinking less of yourself; it is thinking of yourself less." What are some ways that you could make Jesus shine brighter in your life and think of yourself less? In your relationships with your spouse, or kids, or parents? How does this change your friendships? Will you commit to search for those who need friends rather than depend on those who will serve you as friends? How should this change the way you serve your family and neighbors with the most lowly, menial tasks?
 - 6. What is one way that you will work to make Jesus greater in your heart and life this week?







