SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Luke 15:11-32 - Joyful Coming and Going

Questions for family/small group discussions:

How does the gospel and God's Word hold up a mirror for us? How have you experienced this for your own heart and life?

1. A mirror held up for us:

a. How does the elder brother relate to his father and how does that impact or influence the way that he relates to his prodigal brother? Can you see how the way that you are relating to God each day influences the way that you relate to others?

b. Why does the elder brother care little or nothing for his younger brother? Or, why did the religious leaders care little or nothing for the sinners that Jesus was pursuing? How could this reveal your own heart and your own lack of care or action toward those who are "sinners" or on the outside?

c. What is your most common response to those who don't somehow meet your standards or expectations? Can you see how we can become bigoted toward those who are bigoted?

d. How does the elder brother's "goodness" or "obedience" keep him from a loving relationship with his father? How could your "goodness" or "obedience" keep you from a loving relationship with God? Why do you obey God? How does our "goodness" become so deadly for our spiritual condition?

e. What do your prayers reveal about how you relate to God? Do you most often provide a list of petitions or things you need? Or do you more often find yourself in a loving conversation of adoration, confession, and thanksgiving?

2. God held up for us:

a. What do we learn about God and the gospel through the father's actions toward his two sons? How do you see God as a Father looking for and welcoming you? How does this change you?

b. What has Jesus done and at what price to become the true elder brother who searches for and saves us? What is he still doing today to be a faithful elder brother?

c. We see how we are come home with joy and go out searching for others with joy. What makes this joy possible and how can you sustain this joy for the loving obedience that truly pleases our Father in heaven?
