SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Questions for family/small group discussions

Mark 4:1-20 - Seed and Harvest

- 1. What does "selective hearing" look like for you as it relates to God's Word? What are the parts of God's Word that you tend to hear and what parts do you tend to not hear?
- 2. When you consider Jesus' explanation of this parable, what are the consequences of our "selective hearing" as it relates to the Word and the gospel? What does Jesus hold out for us when we truly hear and what does that look like for you and for us as a church?

3 ways that gospel seed works to change us:

- a. When you consider the creation account in Genesis 1-2, and read texts like James 1:18 and 1 Peter 1:23, what do we learn about God's Word? How does the power of the Word impact you today? What are some reasons that the power of God's Word does not impact you and what could you do to change that?
- b. I gave an example of a time when I was publicly beaten down with words of criticism and then revealed how the gospel needs to sprout up in me at that point. What's an example from your life that reveals how the gospel needs to work in your mind, heart and life?
- c. What's the difference between how religion works and how the gospel works in us? What are some ways that you might settle for mechanical or external change for yourself or your family? What does real gospel transformation look like in your relationships with spouse, kids, neighbor, or co-workers?

2. Power that transforms with

- a. How can you work to become "good soil" that produces fruit? What is one step you can take this week to make progress toward nurturing faith or gospel power in your heart/life?
- b. When you consider how Paul responds to Peter's "racism" in Galatians 2:11-14, what is the key phrase in verse 14 that becomes the focus for real heart/life change? What are some ways that you might settle for behavior/external change rather than action that is not in step or in line with the truth of the gospel?
- c. What does it mean to act out of gospel instinct—with the same love and grace that we see and receive from Jesus?

3. Power through ___

- a. What are some of the many ways that the power of Jesus and the gospel is revealed through weakness? What does the metaphor of the seed say about Jesus and the gospel and what does it reveal about how the power of the gospel seed can sprout in you (see John 12:24)?
- b. If the gospel seed is sprouting in your heart, what is your response to criticism, or cold apathy from your spouse, or a strained relationship, or a neighbor/co-worker in need? What has Jesus done and continue to do to make the gospel real and deep in your heart and life? What is your hope for real change?
