SERMON STUDY GUIDE

Questions for family/small group discussions

Haggai 2:6-7, Malachi 3:1-3 - Painful Purification

- 1. How are you impacted by this advent/holiday season? Do the burdens and struggles increase or dissipate for you?
- 2. Charles Jennens compiled the lyrics for Handel's *Messiah*. We learned how the culture and events of Charles Jennens' life influenced his passion for drawing people to Jesus. What are the factors/events that drive your passion for drawing people for Jesus? Or is there a lack of passion for the lost and why might that be?
- 3. What do Haggai 2:6-7, Hebrews 12:26-29, and Malachi 3:1-3 say about how God works when he shakes, rocks, and unsettles us? How have you seen God work to purify and transform you on your life journey? What has been the result for your walk with and love for God?
- 4. If you could erase or edit out various elements of the script for your life story or your child's life story, what would you erase and why? Do you see how God might be working through the failures, setbacks, suffering, and pain of your life? What do you need to know and embrace to have the struggles make you more like Jesus?
- 5. How does pain particularly work in God's efforts to make us more like Jesus? How have you seen pain ultimately yield healing in your or someone else's life?
- 6. Handel's *Messiah* refers to Psalm 69:20 as a reflection of Jesus' heart and life for us. What do we see in this text and in Jesus' life as he moved toward the cross to indicate that Jesus suffers and is in the trench with us? What does Jesus' suffering and sacrifice matter to you?
- 7. What does the gross horror and unfairness of the cross reveal about the world that we live in? What does the cross say about what God was willing to do to rescue us out of our own sin and the sin of this world? What does this say about God and his love for you? Why did Jesus suffer?


